## **Classroom Spotlights**

In English 9, the students are finishing writing their own murder mysteries after finishing reading *Murder on the Orient Express*. They're working on improving their word choices and dialogue skills to really bring the mysteries to life. The 10th graders are combining their creative and argumentative writing skills to write letters from the perspective of a character from a children's book. They're not only learning how to format a letter, but also how to make their writing more interesting with figurative language. Argumentative writing practice is underway for the Juniors in preparation for the ACT. They're learning what writing skills are necessary while improving their own critical thinking skills in the essays. Advanced Composition students recently finished their senior papers and are reading *Fahrenheit 451*. The class is improving their critical thinking and discussion skills when talking about the dystopian world where books are burned and Guy Montag is starting to question the motivation behind those burnings.

Students in Mr. Jones' Civics/Economics class answered the question How Would You Invest \$100,000? by participating in the Economics Wisconsin Stock Market Simulation Game from October 2 - December 8. In this simulation, each team receives a computer-generated \$100,000 to invest in real stocks listed on the NYSE, S&P 500, and NASDAQ markets. This fun and educational learning tool teaches students how to manage a stock portfolio by trading stocks at real time prices. Our Husty students were competing with 318 other teams from Wisconsin. All Hustisford teams made a profit during the game. Congratulations to Evelyn Henderson, Alicia Bykowski and Scarlett Kluewer for placing 5th in the state with a profit of \$27,000.00. Congratulations also to Brody Bridgham and Trey Hildebrandt for placing 13th in the state with a profit of \$16,134.00. Way to go Hustisford students!

Middle School Reading and ELA have been very busy lately! 6th-grade students have turned into journalists throughout December. Students have learned about what makes a good article, how articles are composed to get your attention, and how to write their articles. Students selected a topic they enjoyed and researched it to create an article. Many students wrote about sports, athletes, or travel advice. It has been so fun watching their creativity and passions shine in these articles! 7th-grade students completed a travel brochure for an island in the Caribbean after students read a novel that was located in the Caribbean Sea. Students researched about the country and created a brochure with information about what someone traveling there should expect. Finally, 8th-grade students just finished a poetry verse novel, *Out of the Dust*, which was set in the 1930s Dust Bowl Era Oklahoma. Students did a wonderful job analyzing the poems and discovering the theme of the poems.
