Mr. Bushey Reported: Mr. Bushey reported that there was a nice turn out for parent teacher conferences. Students and two chaperones attended the National FFA Convention at the end of October. Students attended the Wisconsin Education Fair. Students in the tech. ed. department attended a field trip sponsored by the Manufacturing Business Alliance of Dodge County. He provided a Class of 2019 Senior project update. He provided upcoming events to the board as well including NHS induction on November 6.

Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported that McTeacher night in Hartford was a huge success. She thanked all of the staff for working and parents and community members for attending. The elementary school is celebrating Red Ribbon Week and drug awareness. District Facebook posts about Raising Caring Kids have received positive feedback. New Business:

- Update Kris Roeseler—Maintenance projects and schedule Mr. Roeseler updated the committee on a water leak that has started in the HS Science lab in regards to the large rainfall amounts that have happened. He also updated on the gas leak in the HS science lab and that it was repaired by Johnson Controls. Johnson Controls stated that the aging infrastructure within that lab will be of concern and to monitor the area closely. Mr. Roeseler updated that he has been working on cleaning the shed and kitchen areas out. Mr. Roeseler updated the committee on issues with the air conditioning unit for the technology area at the HS. He also updated on issues with the boilers at JHE and the air handling unit.
- Disposal of Items—There are several items in the kitchen area that are not needed or outdated. The kitchen staff will be working to sell some items and dispose of items that are broken our not usable.
- Snow Bid—The district received one bid from Indian Road and will take it to the full board for approval. There were no increases in the bid from the previous year.
- Water Heater Issue at HS—One water heater at the HS has failed. We are currently running with only one to see if there is enough capacity to do so. The situation will be monitored. If there is not enough of a supply, the water heater will need to be replaced.
