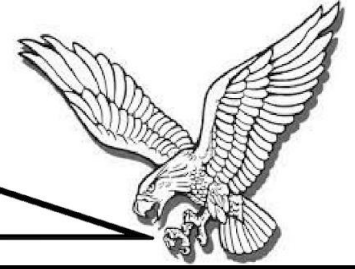

Classroom Spotlights

Every Wednesday in Spanish Class throughout the school year, we listen to a new song and see how many words and phrases we understand. We also rate every song individually. In March, each class gets a separate bracket with all of the songs we've listened to so far this year. We listen to snippets of two songs everyday and vote. English 11 students just finished up creating their own videos analyzing and critiquing the differences between *The Great Gatsby* book and the movie adaptations. They had to plan out what they were going to focus on and how to create a visual that supported what they were analyzing. There were many creative approaches on how to showcase their skills!

The Sophomores had to work on practicing their analytical skills with poetry this month in English class. They had a bracket that included a mixture of traditional and spoken word poems for them to critique. They had to look at how the author approached the subject, the tone, and the poetic techniques to see which poem came out on top. There were many disagreements in each round, but they worked hard in groups to reach the final decisions.

Freshman English classes reenacted scenes from *Romeo and Juliet* together. They took turns reading the lines of the different characters while discussing the plot and character details. They learned about how important it is to think through decisions in life and listening to the advice others give you.
