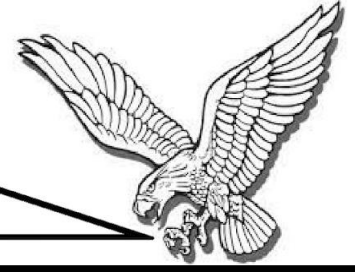

## Classroom Spotlights

Students in Ms Essock's agriculture classes have been busy with hands-on labs and activities throughout quarter 1! 7th & 8th graders in Intro to Ag were able to extract DNA from wheat and brainstorm ways to enhance our wheat crop. Vet Science students completed a physical exam on Kooper, the 5 month old Red Heeler puppy, as well as built animal skeletons out of noodles! Ag Business designed their own cooperative, "L+L Grains". Animal Production frosted beef cow cookies to learn about different breed characteristics. Food Science made homemade pizzas while learning about yeast and beef jerky when learning about dehydration. Ecology went outside to analyze a mini wetland near the school.

Business: Students learning code just finished designing their web pages and now we will be learning how to create interactive animations and games. If you have a son/daughter in Personal Finance, ask them about different types of investments, retirement plans, or credit available to consumers. From what Mrs. Jaeck heard at conferences, some students may be asking you the questions which definitely makes for good dinner conversations. With Halloween, Entrepreneurship students did a quick project about dead companies, or companies that no longer exist or filed bankruptcy. Sometimes learning from mistakes keeps us from making them ourselves. If you have a son/daughter in Computer Concepts, we just finished learning how to format letters and address envelopes. Students are hoping for some fan mail to be returned after mailing to some favorite celebrities. We also took the time to write thank you letters to teachers.

6th grade Social Studies has just finished up their unit of Mesopotamia. We looked at several empires of this region and how they met the requirements of a civilization, food supply, government, religion, written language, social structure, arts, and technology. The students were then asked to create a display of their empire to teach others about these important topics. Students worked on being specific and writing in complete sentences and were very creative with the pictures they chose to enhance their displays.
