We are truly blessed within our district. We are blessed with a wonderful staff, great students, and a supportive community. The Board of Education and I encourage community members to ask questions and visit our schools. Come find out what we have to offer. We are off to a great start this year!

Superintendent's Annual Report to the Board of Education and Community

Dear School Board Members and Members of the Hustisford School District Community:

I want to start out this evening by saying thank you for the opportunity provided to me to serve as the superintendent of schools for the Hustisford School District. I am humbled and honored to work for this community. The unwavering dedication to your school and most of all our students is what makes this community unique. I have the privilege each day to work with individuals who are dedicated to our students. Thank you to the Board of Education for supporting the great work being done by our staff and supporting the education of our students, your support is noted and appreciated.

Our school year has started with many different initiatives being worked on. Some of these initiatives have caused challenges for us. Although we know that we will face challenges throughout the year, we will work together to meet these challenges and always make decisions with our students in mind. Although these challenges arise, they will be met with many successes that we, as a district, can celebrate. I am excited about what is happening in this district and the challenges and celebrations that we have.

I want to take a moment to outline initiatives that the board and community have invested in that have had or will have a long-lasting impact on our students.

There have been several curricular changes that have occurred this year. The Sr. High is offering two additional AP classes, AP Biology and AP Human Geography. The AP Calculus class is broadcasted live to Horicon and Dodgeland daily. Offering these classes puts our students in position to gain more college credit prior to leaving our doors. We purchased new Social Studies Curriculum K-12. This purchase allows our students and teachers access to the most up-to-date curriculum published. We purchased new curriculum for several agriculture classes as well. The board voted to add a full-time agriculture teacher and enhance our program here in Hustisford. The decision allows our students additional electives within both agriculture and science. We added new math offerings for students as well, helping to better prepare students for post-secondary math. This year there were new business classes offered as well, enhancing the opportunities for students to explore options in the area of marketing and technology. We made changes at the Jr. High as well, implementing a new writing curriculum across all grade levels. They are utilizing Lucy Caulkin's units of writing which is what is used at JHE and provides a consistent approach to teaching from K-8 grade. Jr. High students were also allowed to take exploratory classes in agriculture this year. All of these changes are for the students. The Elementary Students not only received new social studies this year, their math was updated to the latest edition, and a new reading curriculum was implemented. The elementary school now teaches both reading and writing using Lucy Caulkins. This provides continuity for students and a rigorous curriculum that prepares students for the next challenges. Finally, the elementary school is implementing The Zones of Regulation. This is a social emotional framework to help foster self-regulation and emotional control. There is a lot going on in our schools. Our teachers are being faced with new challenges, but our students are getting the most up-to-date rigor in curriculum that will help them to be successful into the future.

The district also made a commitment to children and hired a new school psychologist this year. Brining on a full-time staff member in this position provide for the social emotional support of children as well as support in both regular and special education.

We are providing more opportunities for students both academically and athletically. Our Cooperative Agreement programs continue to be successful. Our district teams are also continuing to grow and provide challenges to others within the conference. This year we will be adding track and field to our spring athletic offerings. We have added new clubs to the menu of options for students at all grade levels. It is amazing to see our students take initiative and build support for their passion. Many of our other clubs and programs continue to build membership and provide opportunities for our students to grow and develop. These are only a few ways that we are working to provide more opportunities for our children.

Several projects were recently completed and in the process of being completed for the district. Most noticeably, the parking lots were resurfaced and repaired and new drainage was installed as well. The district supported the booster club to help finish the concession stand project. New technology upgrades are being completed and new devices were purchased for students and staff. Upgrades that focus on the safety and security of our children are also in the works. Our district was awarded \$60,301.00 in state school safety grants this year. New locks are being installed, more security cameras will be installed, shatter resistant film is being installed at front entrances, first aid kits are being purchased, and training is being done for staff. Along with the school safety grants, our district secured \$72,265.00 in a federal rural schools grant this year. This funding will be used for the purchase of technology and curricular items. Teachers and administrators write grants regularly to help supplement what the community already does for our schools. Grant funding helps us bring new and exciting things to

students. Last year our PE department received kayaks through a grant, this year, we are getting a hockey rink installed between the buildings.



Our buildings continue to age. We have done several improvements throughout each building, but as our systems age, inevitably pieces start to fail. We are currently participating in a facility study to gauge the life of the buildings. Our student population growth has caused space issues in both buildings. Teachers are being asked to be creative with the spaces that they have. We have teachers in each building teaching classes in conference room sized spaces. We have art in the cafeteria once again at JHE. Student growth is a positive thing, but our buildings are not made to continue to expand. We have creatively made space for students, but the challenge that we face is as we add more programming and students, our buildings cannot support it. The board and community are faced with this issue over and over. We will be forced once again to make budgetary decisions for our aging buildings. We will continue to maintain and do projects. This year, we have more students into our district through open enrollment than we have out. This is an exciting time for growth for all involved.

The district is moving forward and facing the challenges with great determination. We want to make Hustisford competitive and make our students high achieving, high functioning citizens. We have so much to be proud of. I ask for continued support from our community. I ask for our community to come and see what we are all about and what we have to offer. I am very proud to be here serving the district and the children. It is always a great day to be a falcon.

A. Principals' Reports:

<u>Mr. Bushey Reported</u>: Mr. Bushey reported that staff members participated in the Why Try curriculum training during in-service week. He also reported that the new ice rink has arrived. He provided an update on enrollment and senior projects. He provided information to the board on spirit week. He also discussed an option working with Yamaha outboard motors for the tech ed. department. Finally, he provided an overview of what the staff participated in during in-service week.

<u>Ms. Bell Reported</u>: Ms. Bell reported that current JHE enrollment is 179 students. She updated the board on the PALS testing schedule. She provided important date reminders that are upcoming including picture day and 5th grade parent band night. She updated on the Birdseed Backpack project. She discussed the school wide behavior program and the tickets students can earn. Finally she updated the board on child find activities and after school study hall.

C. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal reported that fall sports are all underway. Volleyball is having an outstanding season as is football. He reported that he will be attending the WIAA district meeting. He also provided updates of WIAA information that will be discussed at the area meeting including Districts for Football in the 2020 season as well as felony convictions for WIAA athletes.

D. Financial Director's Report: Mr. Kiefer provided information that the audit has been completed. He also discussed the amount of money being placed into fund balance. He provided an update and comparison for the 16/17 budget vs. the 17/18 budget. He discussed that the district received \$176,000 in sparsity aide this year. He also updated the board that the district received a rural schools grant written by Mr.

Kiefer and Mrs. Cramer in the amount of \$72,265.00.

E. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported that in-service week was successful and well received by staff members. Staff members completed Stop the Bleed training as part of the school safety grant initiative. The staff also was trained in blood borne pathogens and mandated reporting. The staff was also trained by two Dodge County drug detectives on drug awareness. The Community Fair was successful. The district is participating in the newly formed Dodge County task force on opioid and other substance abuse. The district will be providing training to all staff in regards to the WI Retirement System. Mrs. Cramer updated the board on the district's participation with the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation. Mrs. Cramer also updated the board on the various meetings that she is attending at the regional and local level. She also updated the board that she will be attending the State of Education Address in Madison. Mrs. Cramer also updated the board that the district is positive 8 students for open enrollment this year, this is great news for the district.

New Business:

• Update Kris Roeseler—Maintenance projects and schedule – Mr. Roeseler updated the committee on the various projects being completed in the buildings and on the grounds. He reported that the water heater installed in 2011 at the HS is leaking and he is receiving estimates on its cost for repair or replacement. At this time it is offline and the district is determining if one water heater has the capacity to meet needs and demands in that area of the building prior to making a decision. He also reported that the air handling unit for John Hustis is having issues with timing and that the district is working with Johnson Controls on this issue.

• Custodial Scheduling and Staffing –The committee talked about the number of custodial hours being worked and the work load. The staff is back to full staff minus the $\frac{1}{2}$ time position added last year. The district will monitor hours and work.

• Building level updates/concerns—Projects in each building update above

• Classroom space update—Both buildings are operating at capacity. At JHE all classrooms and storage areas are being utilized. The final classroom was placed in the conference room. Art is operating out of the cafeteria. There are no empty spaces within the building. At the Jr./Sr. High all spaces are being utilized. There is a classroom operating out of the conference room off of the library as well. Storage spaces have been converted into office space as well. All areas are being utilized by the staff.


