## DISTRICT ADMINISTRATOR MESSAGE

This message for first quarter is the address given at the Annual Board Meeting for the Hustisford School District on October 10, 2022

Good evening,

I want to start out this evening by recognizing the Board of Education on the dedication that they show to our students, staff, and community each day. The diligence of our board members and their leadership has put the district into a very positive situation.

I am humbled and honored to serve the Hustisford School District as both the Superintendent of Schools as well as the JHE Principal. I am blessed each day with an administrative team that dedicates themselves to helping our students and district. Their leadership whether it be with finances or students is appreciated and recognized. We are blessed in our district to have amazing teachers and support professionals that work with students and address district needs daily. I pride myself in working to build a team that fits together and supports each other professionally and personally. We have built a strong staff and work to ensure that we have high quality educators in front of our children. We have faced workforce challenges that have required creativity and patience. We have faced these challenges with a commitment not to settle and a diligence to find our fit and find the best.

As you have heard me say over and over, we have faced challenges, but we face them with determination. We have been faced with a stagnant budget from our legislators. We have not seen an increase in school funding for our district and across the State. Schools were made to rely on ESSER funding. The intention of the funding was not to sustain schools, but to provide opportunities to build on what we had in place to help with the learning loss that many students experienced. Our district is dedicated to keeping this funding for its intended purpose while budgeting wisely and maintaining costs within the district in a financially sound manner. We have added programming to help students.

We continue to enhance our curricular offerings in order to help our students learn, grow, and remain competitive. We have done this with no new funding and support. Our district is operating a positive budget unlike many districts across the state who are seeing significant deficits. Our district's property valuation saw an increase this year which has helped us to lower our mill rate once again. However, while we can boast a decrease in our mill rate, we would have seen a bigger decrease but the State's voucher program has created a funding tension in our district. Our tax payers are not only paying for our public schools as outlined in our state constitution, but now our tax payers are also paying for private schools for students who qualify for a voucher. This year, 53 cents of our mill rate is from the voucher program. Our mill rate is set at \$6.53. This program does not directly impact our budget in the schools, but it directly impacts our tax payers. This program has been a challenge across the state and has caused financial challenges for many districts. Planning this year was challenging as we do not know what the future holds in regards to our state budget. We budgeted with a zero increase in mind in regards to funding. DPI recently released their thoughts on the next school budget for the state. Key points that would directly impact our district are increased pupil aid, increased revenue limit authority, increased categorical special education support, increased funding in sparsity aid, and transportation aid. Also included was an investment in helping with the workforce and educator pipeline, several mental health initiatives, increased funding for financial literacy and reading as well as a commitment to ACP funding. Finally, the budget truly takes a look at the whole child and supports increased funding for reimbursements to once again ensure that students have meals at school

free of charge. While this is only a proposal, there are factors within this budget that give us hope. It is up to our legislators once again to put Wisconsin at the top for education. We will continue to do what we can with what we have.

The district continues to prioritize maintenance issues. HVAC continues to be our main focus along with updates to technology infrastructure. We continue to encounter HVAC issues and are working to keep both our heating and cooling systems up and running. We know that issues exist in both buildings. Through our engagement with Kraemer Brothers and HSR Architects, we are taking necessary steps to build a strong foundation with facilities master planning. Our community engagement sessions are providing valuable feedback that the board and administration can use to come up with a plan that is not only supported by tax payers, but sustains the district well into the future.

This past year we had many successes. We do it right; we keep our students as our #1 focus. Our community support has been and continues to be amazing. The support our kids receive is like no other. We are so proud of what we have done and where we are going.

The District is moving forward, we face challenges with grit and determination. Our mission statement focuses on empowering all students to learn the skills, acquire the knowledge, and develop the attitudes necessary to reach their full potential as citizens who can meet the challenges of a global society. We will do just that! We are preparing our kids to perform for life. I ask for continued support from the community. Together, as a team, we can achieve more. I am so proud of all we have done and all we have yet to accomplish.

# What's Happening in 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade



The second graders have been busy during the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter. They have worked hard to learn classroom expectations and classroom routines. 2<sup>nd</sup> graders have been working hard to follow the Falcon Way and be leaders in our school by showing how to be respectful, responsible and safe. They have loved earning “Falcon Tickets” and “Baumgartner Bucks” for showing expected behavior. Every Friday they are able to go shopping in the Baumgartner store with the bucks they earn during the week. This also allows us to work on our skill of counting money!

In math, we have been working hard on solving different kinds of word problems. This is a big focus in the beginning of second grade. We will be starting to learn how to add and subtract with regrouping. We have also been working on our fact fluency by mastering our facts in both addition and subtraction.

In writing this quarter we learned about personal narrative writing and the writing process. We have spent time learning how to plan, draft, revise, edit and finally publish our writing. Each month we set personal goals of what we want to work on during writing workshop. Students have enjoyed learning how to edit their stories with a partner and turning that writing into a published piece of work.

In reading, we have been focusing on the skills of sequencing our stories, recognizing the character’s feelings, and finding text features in non-fiction texts. We have also been working on reading longer books and working on our comprehension.

We have also enjoyed lots of fun activities this quarter! 2<sup>nd</sup> graders were faced with the challenge of Unlocking Halloween! Students were asked to solve a number of math challenges to get out of a Haunted House and earn a prize! In October, we also met with our 4K buddies for a Halloween activity. We love spending time with our 4K buddies and doing activities with them! In November, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders held a mock election for JHE. Students make posters, made a debate video and ran the polling place on election day!

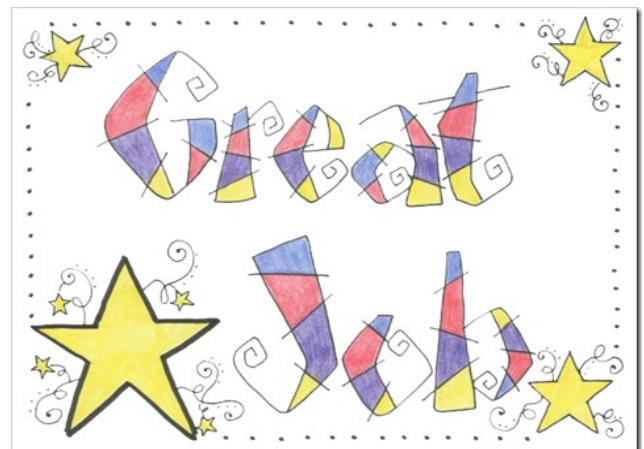
FFA Fruit sale was November 7<sup>th</sup> through the 21<sup>st</sup>. Delivery will be December 13, 2022.

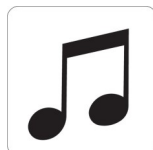

# KINDERGARTEN News . . . .



Kindergarten has been off to a great start! We have been following the Falcon Way in our classroom and around the school. We are respectful, responsible and safe. We have earned the You Rock award from the office, the Golden Broom from Mr. Steve, and the golden shoes for great behavior in p.e. We also have earned any falcon tickets for our great behavior!

We have been busy learning all of our sounds in phonics. We have been practicing forming our letters correctly and using these sounds during writer's workshop. We can independently write for fifteen minutes by drawing a detailed picture, labeling five items in our story. Some of us have begun to write a sentence to accompany our writing.

In math we have focused on the numbers 1-10. We have been working on counting to 30 every day. We can write our numbers, recognize a group of 5 in the numbers 6-10. We have learned to add within 5 and can recognize five different two dimensional shapes. Every 10 days of school we receive a note from Zero the Hero. He leaves us a treat hidden in our classroom. The treat is something in the shape of a zero. On November 11 we will have a special celebration for the 50<sup>th</sup> day of school!

During reader's workshop we are looking at books for fifteen minutes independently. We also have time to read with a partner. We also love the app EPIC to listen to stories twice a week. We have been practicing sight words (snap words as we call them, our goal is to read them in a snap). We have one little book a week that practices one of our snap words that we color and read every day.

In Guidance we have worked on our rules for learning. We need to listen, focus our attention, follow directions, use self-talk, and be assertive. Next we will focus on feelings and empathy. In science we are learning all about pushes and pulls. In social studies we talked about learning and working together. Next we will talk about work now and long ago.

We have a buddy classroom. Third grade is our buddy class and we love to do activities once a week with them. We have enjoyed our time together on Fridays. We love seeing them in the hallway and saying hi when we meet.

In October we took a field trip to Ebert's Greenhouse in Ixonia along with 4k. We had a beautiful day to hear a story, make a craft, go on a hayride to choose a pumpkin and play on some giant haybales! We loved having the firefighters come to visit. We learned about their uniforms and even got to sit in the firetruck. Police Officer Ryan paid us a visit and read to us. He read There Was An Old Lady Who Swallowed a Bat. Mrs. Cramer also read her favorite Halloween story to us. We love to have guest readers come and read to us!
