Superintendent's Annual Report to the Board of Education and Community

Dear School Board Members and Members of the Hustisford School District Community:

I want to start out this evening by saying thank you for the opportunity provided to me to serve as the superintendent of schools for the Hustisford School District. I am humbled and honored to work for this community. The unwavering dedication to your school and most of all our students is what makes this community unique. I have the privilege each day to work with individuals who are dedicated to our students. Thank you to the Board of Education for supporting the great work being done by our staff and supporting the education of our students, your support is noted and appreciated.

Our school year has started with many different initiatives being worked on. Some of these initiatives have caused challenges for us. Although we know that we will face challenges throughout the year, we will work together to meet these challenges and always make decisions with our students in mind. Although these challenges arise, they will be met with many successes that we, as a district, can celebrate. I am excited about what is happening in this district and the challenges and celebrations that we have.

I want to take a moment to outline initiatives that the board and community have invested in that have had or will have a long-lasting impact on our students.

There have been several curricular changes that

have occurred this year. The Sr. High is offering two AP classes, AP Calculus and AP Psychology. The AP Calculus class is broadcasted live to Horicon students daily. Offering these classes puts our students in position to gain college credit prior to leaving our doors. We revamped the science offerings at the Sr. High as well. We added two elective science classes, Human Anatomy and Physiology and Earth Science. We also restructured the order in which students are taking classes in order to better prepare them for post-secondary education. We also added math programs and added FTE in Sr. High math. This too is to help better prepare our students for a competitive world. We made changes at the Jr. High as well, implementing a STEM class, a content area reading class, and changing the way certain classes were offered. We also looked to increase the challenges for Jr. high students by allowing them to take advanced math classes as well as high school Spanish. All of these changes are for the students. We implemented a new curriculum for at-risk students at the Sr. High as well. Again, working to ensure that all students succeed. The Elementary students are working in a new writing curriculum as well as a new science curriculum. These changes will prepare them as they journey through our schools.

Within the past year we switched our financial software system to Skyward. This move will enhance and streamline our processes within, but will provide more flexibility in the future with all of the potential of the system. This move will help build the capacity of the entire district office, streamline many procedures across the district, and build transparency for all involved.

We are providing more opportunities for students both academically and athletically. Our Cooperative Agreement programs continue to be successful. Our district teams are also continuing to grow and provide challenges to others within the conference. We have added new clubs to the menu of options for students. Two new clubs that are in progress are an art club and a weight training club. It is amazing to see our students take initiative and build support for their passion. Many of our other clubs and programs continue to build membership and provide opportunities for our students to grow and develop. These are only a few ways that we are working to provide more opportunities for our

children.

There were many projects completed this past summer. A new bathroom was built at the Jr./Sr. high to meet ADA standards. John Hustis had the rest of the



roof replaced. Patch work was done on parking and walkways. New doors were installed at the Jr./ Sr. high as well. Other projects are continuously being completed to add to the life of each of the buildings. Our maintenance crew works diligently to keep our buildings in the best condition possible.

The district is moving forward and facing the challenges with great determination. We want to make Hustisford competitive and make our students high achieving, high functioning citizens. We have so much to be proud of. I ask for continued support from our community. I ask for our community to come and see what we are all about and what we have to offer. I am very proud to be here serving the district and the children. It is always a great day to be a falcon.

I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by President Dave Strysick at 6:31 p.m.

II. Roll call of members

Board members signed the attendance roster at the start of the meeting. Members present: Jay Behnke, Dave Strysick, Tracy Malterer, Steve Weinheimer (entered at 6:32), Lisa Bosse, and Barb May. John Bohonek was absent.

III.Verification of public notice: Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

IV. <u>Public Forum:</u> Christa Gavin addressed the board in regards to 7/8 Grade Football. She asked the board for future support of the program and provided an update on the program. She also asked the board to consider a donation for this year's costs.

A. Principals' Reports:

- Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported on a successful open house at JHE. She talked to the board about the theme for the elementary school for the year. She talked about the screenings being done and the schedule of the upcoming screenings as well. She indicated that the teachers will be participating in Harvest Fest downtown as well.
- Mr. Bushey Reported: Mr. Bushey reported on training opportunities that HS and Jr. High staff have taken advantage of during late summer. He shared the Jr./Sr. high initiatives for the school year, focusing on ACT writing, Trauma Sensitive Educaiton, and Academic and Career Planning. He provided a schedule of dress up days for Homecoming. He updated the board on where the seniors were in regards to senior projects.
- B. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal reported that the fall sports season is in full swing. All teams are currently in conference play. Volleyball is off to a 3-0 start in conference, football is off to a 3-0 start as well. Soccer is in the middle of the pack for conference play with a record of 1-1-1. Junior high volleyball is off to a quick start and the girls are playing well and being very competitive. Mr. Falkenthal reported on the area WIAA meeting that he attended on September 18 in Oconomowoc.

- Update from Kris Roeseler, Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds: Mr.

 how things were going. He also updated on coverage for employees while
 vacations are being filled.
- Summer Maintenance Projects Update: All summer maintenance projects were completed.

Approval of Resolution Opposing WIAA Shot Clock Implementation School Board Resolution #1532

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Hustisford School District does hereby approve a resolution in opposition of the implementation of a shot clock for high school basketball beginning in the 2019-2020 school year.

The Hustisford Board of Education opposes the planned shot clock implementation in high school basketball that would take place and become mandatory for schools in the 2019-2020 school year. The opposition to this implementation is for numerous reasons.



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- Cost of hardware for the implementation
- Cost of worker to run the shot clock for each home game for boys and girls basketball which is approximately 22 regular season games per year and possibly additional playoff games.
- Finding and training an individual or individuals that can operate the clock and have a clear understanding of rules and regulations in relation to the shot clock.
- Concern that the impact for the game of high school basketball is actually little to no impact to the game itself.
- Concern that the implementation provides another opportunity for the fans
 to criticize a worker for error or for fans to use count downs, etc. This is an
 issue that WIAA has worked with schools to alleviate with student/fans in
 regards to what they are allowed to chant and cheer, they are reintroducing
 areas for these things to again cause issues.

For these reasons, we, as the Hustisford School District, are standing united in the opposition of the shot clock implementation by the WIAA. We stand with and support the decision of the Trailways Conference to oppose this implementation as well.

Greetings from Jr./Sr. High School Principal Mr. Clint Bushey



This school year is flying by! With the close of the first quarter on November 3rd right around the corner it seems like we just welcomed students back from summer break. The Fall sport seasons have come to an end with each team making it to post-season play. Great job to all Fall sports athletes. I am

very excited to see what Husty can do now during the Winter sports seasons. I would like to take this opportunity to share with all of you the wonderful things that have been happening and take a little time to celebrate some successes .

- Mr. Koch, with a grant funded by the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation, was able to take most of the students in his Physical Education classes kayaking for an awesome experience of a lifetime activity.
- Mrs. Daley created a project on the website Donors Choose which helps teachers raise funds for needed projects in the classroom.
 Within a weeks time her project allowed a classroom to purchase a set of 30 calculators and was fully funded for a total of \$500.
- The staff of John Hustis Elementary and the Jr. / Sr. High have been inserviced for over a year on a Department of Public Instruction initiative in trauma sensitive mental health training. This training provides staff with techniques and strategies to use while helping students throughout the day.
- A district wide team has been established to analyze and implement strategies and goals throughout the district to help students struggling with mental health needs.
- The district staff have been inserviced in Question Persuade Refer suicide prevention training to help identify students who might be in crisis.
- Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation Mental Health Grant is being used to purchase tools to help students manage their emotions and stay focused in classrooms. The grant additionally purchased curriculum materials for training social and emotional learning.
- Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation Mental Health Grant dollars are being used to bring a speaker to the school and community. Kevin Hines is a brain/mental health advocate, award -winning global speaker, bestselling author and documentary filmmaker who reaches audiences with his story of an unlikely survival and his strong will to live. Two years after he was diagnosed with bipolar disorder (19 years of age), he attempted to take his life by jumping from the Golden Gate Bridge. He is one of only thirty-four to survive the fall, and the only one to regain full physical mobility. He is the only Golden Gate Bridge jump survivor who is actively spreading the message of living mentally healthy. The fall would break his body, but not his spirit. Today, Kevin dedicates his life to saving lives by spreading the message of hope and sharing his art of living mentally well. He is one of the most respected and admired voices of lived experience. Kevin's story is a remarkable testament to the strength of the human spirit and a reminder for us to love the life we have. Wednesday, November 15 at 7:00 PM Hustisford Jr./Sr. High School Gym.

BUS SAFETY

In Wisconsin, we have over 13,000 school buses that transport more than 515,000 students to and from school each school day and travel nearly 70 million miles a year.

An estimated 828 motor vehicles illegally pass Wisconsin school buses every day.

Sometimes drivers are not fully alert and pass a stopped school bus. This is a very dangerous situation for the children, especially the younger ones who may not be watching traffic as closely as they should.

Motorists are required to stop at least 20 feet from a stopped school bus that is displaying flashing red lights and stop arm. Each time a motorist violates the school bus stop law, he or she creates a real hazard for the students who are boarding or leaving the bus.

Wisconsin uses an 8-light school bus earning system. The alternately flashing yellow lights mean caution to other motorists because the bus is preparing to stop. The flashing red lights and stop arm mean stop.

YELLOW LIGHTS mean the bus is going to stop. SLOW DOWN!

RED LIGHTS mean students are getting on or off the bus.
