Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported on volunteer appreciation week. She also discussed intervention at JHE as well as Forward Testing. They had a reading night for families in coordination with summer school registration. There are several teachers that will be touring a school near Milwaukee in regards to using the Zones of Regulation. Students have several upcoming adventures into the community and for field trips, all of which will be exciting days for the students. Fifth grade students Trey Hildebrandt and Adelyn Beisbier invited the board to the 5th grade graduation ceremony on May 29 at 6:30 pm.
