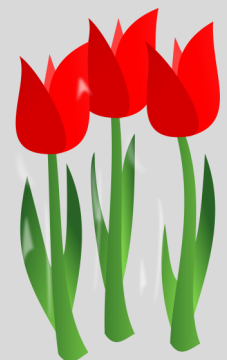

III. Verification of public notice: Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

B. Principals' Reports:

Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported about a recent fundraiser done at JHE. She discussed upcoming state testing. She discussed the upcoming lock-in on April 6. She discussed summer school. She also informed the board about 4K/5K parent information night on April 11 from 5-6 pm. She made the board aware of 5th grade graduation on May 29th at 6:30.

Mr. Bushey Reported: Mr. Bushey told the board about recent assemblies at the MS/HS. He updated the board on the recent Professional Development opportunities that he has had. He discussed truancy issues in the building. He updated the board on the state testing coming up in April. He also updated the board on the DC trip.

C. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal discussed spring sports numbers. Soccer has 33 girls. Baseball has 28, and softball has 15. . 4 girls received all conference recognition in basketball. Julia Peplinski was first team, Alisha Peplinski, second team, and Brittany Fredrick and Cass Ewert were honorable mention. Three boys received recognition as well. Justin Kuehl was first team, Dylan Schmitt was second team, and Nick Bloedel was honorable mention.

D. Financial Director's Report: Mr. Kiefer discussed expenses and revenues through March 19, 2018. He updated the board on athletic admissions and that they were up from last year. He also talked about revenue from student fees. To date we have received about 71% of our tax income. He updated the board on the trainings that he is attending. He also updated the board on the budget status for next year. He provided an overview of all district accounts.

E. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported on the employee compensation committee progress. She also welcomed Mr. Dennis Krueger to the custodial staff. She updated the board on the facility study status. She updated the

board on the progress of the strategic plan with CESA 6. She discussed the various accomplishments of students including Maria Noll and Sophia Hamden on qualifying for state forensics and 6 students who were featured in the Beaver Dam student art show. She updated the board on the various meetings that she has attended over the past month including superintendent meetings at the conference and county level, legislative updates with CESA 6, and Trailways Executive committee meetings. She also updated the board on the mailings and information going out for the referendum.

VIII. Board Development:

A. Community Recognition—Signicast Machine Donation for Tech. Ed. Department: Signicast Investment Castings from Hartford made a donation to the district tech ed. program. They donated a CNC Machining Center. The donation is valued at \$25,000. This includes the machine, tool holders, tools, cooling tray, and all instructional manuals. They also have sent individuals over to train the students on how to use the machine.

B. Concession Stand Project—The board discussed the concession stand project and the funding for it. The board discussed helping the booster club with the project.

C. Dodge County Video—Mrs. Cramer updated the board on a video being done for the Dodge County website. The company doing the video had contacted her. She updated the board on the cost and the other districts that will be participating.

D. Operational Referendum Discussion—The board discussed the operational referendum and the mailings that have gone out.

E. Athletic Updates and Information/Discussion—Mrs. Cramer provided information on the hockey cooperative and information on Track and Field and costs associated.
