I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by President Dave Strysick at 6:30 p.m.

II. Roll call of members

Board members signed the attendance roster at the start of the meeting. Members present: Jay Behnke, Dave Strysick, Tracy Malterer, Steve Weinheimer (entered at 6:32), John Bohonek, and Barb May. Lisa Bosse was absent.

III. Verification of public notice: Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

IV. Public Forum: No one present.

V. Consent Agenda

A motion was made by John Bohonek and seconded by Barb May to approve the Consent Agenda items as presented. Motion passed 5 - 0 by roll call vote.

A motion was made by Jay Behnke and seconded by Tracy Malterer to approve the Regular Agenda as Presented. Motion passed by voice vote.

VII. Reports

A. Principals' Reports:

A. Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported on JHE enrollment. She also talked about the office update at JHE that was done over the summer. She commented on PTC and their first meeting of the year. Finally, she talked about teachers and custodians getting the school and classrooms ready for the upcoming school year.

B. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal reported that the fall sports season is in full swing. All teams are currently practicing. The football numbers for the HS are at 50 with it being split almost even between the two schools. There are 20 boys out for soccer, 8 of them are from Hustisford.

C. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported on upcoming events in the district including registration and the community fair. She congratulated the football team on their early success as well as the volleyball and soccer teams. She updated the board on the various projects being done throughout the district. She congratulated all of the Husty kids who exhibited at the Dodge County Fair and recognized Fay Hildebrandt for her dedication to the FFA program.

VIII. Board Development:

A. WIAA Shot Clock Implementation: Mrs. Cramer and Mr. Falkenthal provided information to the board about the upcoming implementation from WIAA for a shot clock for the 2019-2020 basketball season. The board discussed the plan and were not in favor of the implementation. The board will have a resolution opposing the implementation in September.

B. Director of Finance Position: Mrs. Cramer updated the board on the vacancy in the business office. She provided information to the board about alternatives for the position. The board discussed options and felt that the possibility of looking for a bookkeeper rather than a licensed business manager may work for the district.

C. Strategic Planning: Mrs. Cramer presented options for strategic planning to the board. The board decided that they would like a presentation from CESA 6 on strategic planning. CESA 6 will present information at the September board meeting.

D. Ag Education Program at Hustisford: The agriculture education program was discussed at the board meeting. Mrs. Cramer provided information in regards to the delivery of the program this past year and the challenges that were encountered with the delivery method. She also provided updates on the plans for the upcoming year. She provided alternative ideas to the board and the board encouraged her to explore other options.

## Greetings from Jr./Sr. High School Principal Mr. Clint Bushey

It has been a great start to the school year so far. Now that the excitement of coming back to school is starting to wear off I thought I would share some tips in the event your child talks about conflict or issues at school. The month of October has been declared Bullying Prevention Month. Across the Nation Schools are trying to combat the negativity and conflict that occurs in relationships with students in any grade. Anne Clarkson, digital parenting education specialist with UW-Extension Family Living Programs, works on parenting education and child development. She suggests three tips for parents to prevent and help stop bullying.

## Continued— Jr./Sr. High School Principal Mr. Clint Bushey

- Talk to your child! Even 15 minutes of talking per day can prevent bullying. When parents and children talk, children learn strategies for responding to bullying, feel supported, and gain confidence. Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) actually has a new app called [KnowBullying](#) that can be downloaded for free and offers some ideas to start a conversation.
- Bullies and kids who are bullied are unlikely to ask for help so watch and listen for signs that your child is involved in bullying. For instance, possible signs of bullying include a child faking illness to stay home from school or suddenly losing interest in friends or homework. Although it may be painful to observe, your child is also hurting if he or she is the bully. Bullies may have friends who are bullies; suddenly have new things or more money; or always blame someone else for their problems. The website <http://www.stopbullying.gov/> is a good resource to learn more about bullying.
- Don't ignore bullying. Instead, be an anti-bullying advocate. Stop bullying as soon as you see it by separating the children involved, and getting the facts from all parties (including adults). Support children by talking about the situation and planning what to do if the bullying happens again. Also, make sure to respectfully talk to other adults about your concerns about bullying. For example, talk to your child's teacher privately or talk to other parents and ask them to keep an eye out for bullying.

One of the best ways parents can prevent bullying is by modeling positive relationship skills. When parents show children from the time they are little how to get along with others and how to deal with disagreements in a respectful, assertive way, they are giving children important skills to deal with future conflict.

At Hustisford we are excited to bring many new ideas and programs that can help combat bullying. With help from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation Grant our school will bring in Nationally renowned speakers to help improve the culture within the hallowed halls of Husty. The first speaker, Kevin Hines will present to the entire student body and then again at 7:00 p.m. for the community on November 15th. The staff has been working hard this summer attending different workshops and trainings to help with student needs and improving classroom climates. Together, we can make a change in the culture and environment for the students, school, and community. Thank you in advance for making a difference in the lives of the kids, students, and community.

## Directory Data/Information

The Board designates as student "directory data/information": a student's name; address; telephone number; date and place of birth; photograph; major field of study; participation in officially-recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; dates of attendance; school attended, date of graduation; or awards received.

Except as otherwise provided, directory data may be disclosed to any person (other parents, planning parties, post-secondary institutions, military recruiters, etc.) after the school has: (a) notified the adult student or parent, legal guardian or guardian ad litem of a minor student of the categories of information which it has designated as directory data with respect to each student, (b) informed such persons that they have 14 days to inform the school that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without their prior consent, and (c) allowed 14 days for such persons to inform the school, in writing, of all the directory data items they refuse to permit the District to designate as directory data about that student. The District will not release directory data earlier than 14 days after the initial written notice to the adult student or parent or guardian or after the District has been restricted from doing so by any of those parties. This notice serves as notification of the District's plan to release directory data as permitted in this policy. (School Board Policy - 8330)

## Hustisford School District Notice of Educational Options

Per Wisconsin State Statute 118.57(1)(2), the Hustisford School District is required to notify parents of the educational options available to children who reside in the district, as well as provide notification of the school's accountability report.
