Hustisford Happenings

From the Desk of Mrs. Cramer, District Administrator

Congratulations to the Class of 2024! As we work on closing out the 2023-2024 school year, we are planning for the 2024-2025 school year. We have hired several new candidates that will be filling vacancies created. We are excited for the new staff to join us. It has been a busy hiring season and it is not over yet. We work diligently to ensure that we have the best staff in front of our students.

The Hustisford School District Board of Education has been busy discussing the referendum that failed in April. The Board continues to focus on the needs within both buildings. In June, they approved a replacement of an AC unit for the technology area of the HS. This area houses all of the district servers and technology infrastructure. This is an essential element to keep going. This project will be complete as soon as possible with scheduling. The Board has also approved a fix to the HS AC unit. The HS boilers were also replaced. Although the Board is looking at fixes, the issues remain. The Board has identified several areas to focus on for a potential future referendum. These areas include but are not limited to HVAC updates in both buildings, a roof at the HS with adequate and appropriate drainage, windows in both buildings, lighting and ceiling replacement at JHE, and overall drainage at the HS. These areas have been identified in the past two facility studies completed. Both facility studies completed identified the same issues. In 2020, the district sent out a survey to the community and the same issues were identified in that survey. The Board and Administration are working to find solutions to these issues. Voters will likely see another referendum question come before them. The Board is taking appropriate steps to determine if it is feasible to have a question on the November ballot. If a question would appear on the ballot in November, the Board would need to make that decision with an approved question by their meeting in August.

As we prepare for the upcoming school year, we are certainly excited. We have so much to be proud of in Hustisford. We are excited to make 2024-2025 the best yet!

WHAT WE ARE LEARNING:




Reading: The students are meeting with their book club members to read and discuss what's going on in their specific book. They get to work on building vocabulary and making many different connections in their story.



Middle of May we focused our storybooks and activities on National Police Week by making police badges and thank you cards for the police men in the community. As we wrap up now with the last week of school I appreciated the opportunity of having the help of Sophomore Kadie and Senior Erin for all their after school help with Kid's Club, I couldn't have done it without both of you! This year truly flew by with such amazing kids enrolled in Kid's Club with doing such fun activities and crafts! Happy Summer Break!



What's Happening in Ms. Stewart's High School English Classes

Being able to use different forms of media and technology to communicate ideas is an important skill to practice. This quarter, the Juniors learned about different technologies while creating their own podcast episodes. We started off listening to different podcasts and reviewing them as a class. We talked about what elements the podcasters used that enhanced the episodes and which ones were distracting. They chose topics unique to them and worked on developing an outline or a script to use while recording themselves. Some students even interviewed other people to be guests on their episode. They used audio editing websites to make sure their episodes were exactly how they wanted them to sound. After they finished their episodes, we talked about what goes into a well-written review of a product. They practiced writing reviews of each others' podcast episodes. This unit allowed them to apply the writing and communication skills they've worked on previously in a different way.

The Sophomores worked on building up their confidence levels while learning about public speaking. These skills are important to learn about and practice for any future career path they choose. Their first speech topic was about their favorite moment so they could practice the voice and body language skills discussed in class with a topic they were comfortable with. They also practiced using a visual aid effectively when they had to research a topic to inform the class about. They had to create a Google Slides presentation that followed the rules of an effective visual aid. They had fun with impromptu speeches with topics they created for each other. The unit ended with debates where they had to research their topics ahead of time and listen to their opponent to be able to respond to their arguments during the debate.

Reflecting about your own learning process while going through it can be challenging. The Freshmen worked on understanding their own research process by completing an I-Search paper. This allows them to think and reflect on themselves throughout the process of finding information and writing a research paper. They started with acknowledging what they already knew about their chosen topics and what they wanted to find out about it while researching. Then they documented what they did while they researched, writing down anything they struggled or succeeded with while searching for three different types of sources. They practiced including the research in their own words and documenting their sources using MLA formatting. The last piece of the paper was reflecting on what they learned about themselves through this unit. They not only learned a lot about their topic, but also about their strengths and weaknesses when researching. They will build on these skills next year when writing a full research paper.
