- The Pixellot cameras located in the gym and field are updated and ready for the upcoming seasons. The update took place on July 12th. Information will be going out to families to sign up for the service.
- Senior Project Update
 - 9 out of 22 students have an accepted Senior Project proposal.
- The floors in the Jr. / Sr. High school building were completed in June. The Custodial staff and helpers have now moved on to maintenance in both buildings. The staff is doing a great job getting this building ready for the start of the school year. Thank you Mike Healy for your years of service.
- The Hustisford School District was again awarded the AODA grant for the 2022-23 school year. On June 28th, a \$15,000 budget proposal was accepted and approved. This year the grant will provide funding for curriculum additions, staff development, student activities, and student programs.

Mrs. Cramer Reported:

- Second session of Summer school is in full swing at JHE. Classes are filled and kids are happy and having fun. We
 have about 90 students enrolled this session. Classes run through July 29.
- We have been getting inquiries from families moving into the area and looking to open enroll. I have some tours set
 up and know that we have several incoming students to JHE that will be new to us next year. It is always exciting to
 get new families in.
- Kids Club is operating daily after the Village Rec program. They are open from 3-6. We will have a high school student working daily with Ashley as our numbers are sitting at about 13 students on average.
- JHE hallways are getting painted. It has already started to brighten things up. It is great to give it a fresh new look.
- There are four classrooms that are being cleaned and some office spaces currently. The crew is working in spaces that are available and I will continue to make adjustments as they move through to get other spaces cleaned as well.
- I am currently working on handbooks for Kids Club and JHE that will be ready for the August board meeting.
- Registration is just around the corner. Parents will be getting notified about registration via Blackboard and through social media.
- Open House is August 31 from 4-6.

D. Superintendent's Report

Mrs. Cramer Reported:

- I finished up our end of the year Title Reports
- The school calendar report to DPI has been submitted.
- I began working on the 22-23 Title information in Wise Grants. The initial pieces are complete, I am waiting for allocations to come out to finalize the Title paperwork.
- I worked with the principal at Bethany on Title.
- Summer school has one week left. The staff are doing an amazing job with students and you can see it on the kids' faces. There are currently about 90 students enrolled in session 2. Session 2 runs through July 29.
- We conducted interviews and have candidates to move forward with tonight. I am looking to schedule Food Service
 interviews on July 27 in the AM. We are still looking for custodial candidates. We also have posted a JV Volleyball
 position. We will be looking to set up interviews for the HS Boys Basketball position as well in the next week. We still
 have two teaching positions posted as well.
- Dena and I met with a company today in regards to offering Speech and Language services for our district.
- We are working on the beginning of the year in-service schedule. We have a keynote speaker set with the topic being "Awakening your Why". We also have a table top activity with Dodge County Emergency Management planned.
- Wednesday I have a meeting for the Dodge County Emergency Team. This is a committee that I am the school representative on. This is a bi-annual meeting.
- Jessica and I will be attending a meeting with our insurance broker at the beginning of August to discuss what our plan
 offers and ideas for our consortium.
- I am signed up for a WASB webinar on the referendum process. This is a two-part series that will focus on both community engagement and the process.
- The Community Fair is scheduled for August 23.
- Our kick-off meeting is tomorrow with HSR and Kraemer. This is a small meeting to just hear from the two firms. It will be about 1 ½ hours and get our process moving. The first steps will be determined as far as when the firms will come into learn about the facilities and our condition.
- Hustisford Village National Night Out is August 2.
- Dodge County Schools will have their annual school safety meeting on August 3.
- I am working with Walgreens to offer a flu clinic for staff onsite this year. Tentatively we have it set for October 14, which is an in-service day.

- Congratulations to Ethan Maas on his performance at the SCTP National Trap Shoot this past week. He shot 189 out of 200 in 16yd. trap. The trap team has their end of the year banquet on July 28.
- The air compressor at JHE has two failed pumps. Bassett is working on finding replacements. Currently, it is quite warm in the building as we do not have ac.
- We are having several issues with AC units within both buildings. I am working with Bassett on these issues. There
 is also an issue with an exhaust fan in the art room at the HS that needs to be fixed. The water heater at JHE is
 tentatively scheduled to be installed next week. The HS water heater is still on order and tentatively set for delivery to
 them the week of August 22.

New Business:

- Maintenance Update— The HS building has all floors finished. The maintenance team is now working on floors at
 JHE. There are four classrooms that were not in use for summer school. As they finish, they will move people from
 summer school. They continue to work on other items as well in each building.
- Staffing Update—Two custodial positions are open, no applicants yet. Two new hires for JHE. There are a few other
 applications coming in for other positions.
- Future Facilities Planning—The kick off meeting with Kraemer and HSR is on July 19 at 10 am. Mrs. Cramer will update on who needs to attend when she finds out. The HSR team will attend along with Kyle Kraemer. Greg is on vacation and will join for meeting #2.
- Summer 2022 Projects—The gardens will be removed at JHE before the start of school. Tree removal is being
 looked into for the dead trees around campus. Mrs. Cramer indicated that Poblocki was out to look at the HS parking
 lot and other areas of concern she has not heard from them yet.
- Current building maintenance issues/concerns—There are some HVAC issues going on at JHE. There are several
 rooms that are very hot. Bassett has been contacted. Mrs. Cramer and Mr. Bushey met with Bassett to get detailed
 reports of what they have done and what is of concern and what can wait for a bit. The water heaters will likely go in
 during early August.
- Bassett Maintenance Contract—The maintenance contract is up for renewal. There is no increase from last year. At
 this time, the committee discussed the importance of staying with Bassett. They are willing to work with the
 referendum team as well to provide needed information and updates.
