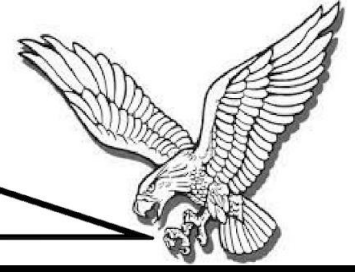

Middle School English Language Arts students recently completed their state testing in ELA. Although the state testing is done, students are still working hard to develop their skills! In 6th grade, students are reading a thrilling mystery! Students are acting as detectives to decipher the clues about who killed Sam Westing in *The Westing Game*. 7th-grade students are exploring the benefits (and MANY downfalls) of a dystopian society while reading *The Giver*. 8th-grade students wrapped up a long historical fiction unit in reading and will be starting their final unit of the year: Intro to Drama. Students will learn about the history of plays and the components of drama. Students will practice their skills with small skits, reader theater, and monologues. All students will also have an end-of-the-year writing assignment. 6th and 7th split class will dive into a persuasive writing unit with some high-interest research. Students will research a vacation spot and develop a presentation about why people should visit their selected location. 8th graders will write a literary essay about two short stories. Students should be proud of their hard work this year and continue to finish strong!
