HUSTISFORD SCHOOL DISTRICT Regular Board of Education Meeting Minutes Monday July 16, 2018

I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by President John Bohonek at 6:30 p.m.

II. Roll call of members

Board members signed the attendance roster at the start of the meeting. Members present: Jay Behnke, Dave Strysick, Tracy Malterer, John Bohonek, Lisa Bosse, Steve Weinheimer, and Barb May.

III. <u>Verification of public notice</u>: Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

IV. Public Forum: None

V. Consent Agenda

The purpose of the Consent Agenda is to provide a mechanism where the Board can dispose of routine matters that must by law come before this body.

A motion was made by Steve Weinheimer and seconded by Lisa Bosse to approve the Consent Agenda items as presented. Motion passed 7 - 0 by roll call vote.

VI. <u>Regular Agenda</u>

A motion was made by Jay Behnke and seconded by Tracy Malterer to approve the Regular Agenda. Motion passed by voice vote.

A. Principals' Reports:

Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported on summer school enrollment and the fun being had by all students involved. She also provided an update on Lucy Caulkins Reading program being implemented at JHE this year. She provided information on the Zones of Regulation and a conference that a group of teachers will attend. The Zones will be implemented school-wide this next school year. She also provided an enrollment update for 2018-2019 at JHE.

Mr. Bushey Reported: Mr. Bushey provided an update on senior projects for both 2018 and 2019. He also provided an update on scheduling for the MS and HS. He provided the results from Brighter Smiles Dental outreach program within our district. Finally, he updated the board on a mindfulness training that was done for the staff in July.

- B. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal reported that the athletic code meeting will be July 22, 2018.
- C. Financial Director's Report: Mr. Kiefer provided information to the board on revenue and expenses so far this year. He showed various accounts and their budget details. He reported that the district was able to put funds into the fund balance this year. He updated the board that the auditors would be in the district on August 6 and 7.
- D. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported that the district was notified that it received a DOJ safety grant for just over \$41,000. Summer cleaning is underway and the staff is busty getting both buildings ready. Two positions are posted for food service. Unesco continues to work with the team on the facility study. The district is continually receiving information from them on the state of the buildings. The district will have a School Resource Officer available 6 hours per week thanks to the Village of Hustisford. The village board stood behind the proposal and is working to ensure a safer school and community. Mrs. Cramer reported on the various meetings that she has had and training. She will attend the athletic code meeting along with Mr. Falkenthal to help address any questions about the changes made if needed. The new internet connection is up and running and there is a noticeable difference.

VIII. Board Development:

- A. Teacher Handbook—The board discussed the teacher handbook which has not been updated since 2013. There was significant discussion around the Early Retirement language. The board offered suggestions for the committee to review.
- B. School Safety Seminar Recap—Tracy Malterer provided a recap of the school safety seminar she attended on July 13.

- C. Open Gym Policy—The board discussed a request for open gym time. The board discussed that this should be a possible position within the community education programming for the district. The board discussed that the gym is highly used for coach meet dates throughout the summer and that if an open gym were to be scheduled that it should be through coach's request or through a district sponsored time.
- D. Graduation Date—The board discussed the graduation date for Hustisford High School. Currently the students graduate on a Friday night. With the inclusion of a track and field program next year, if a senior student made it to the state meet; they would potentially miss the graduation ceremony. The board introduced various ideas about a Sunday graduation or maybe a week night. The board will continue to have the discussion.

IX. Committee Reports:

<u>Building and Grounds Committee:</u> John Bohonek, Committee Chair reported on the July 9, 2018 meeting:

New Business

- Unesco presentation: Mid-Audit Meeting: The committee received an update from Unesco on the status of the building study being conducted. Preliminary information was provided on each building. The discussion centered on all of the systems within each building and the life expectancy of each system compared to the current age. The utilities were also analyzed for spending in each building. Finally, the physical make-up of the buildings was analyzed. A team of educators and employees along with school board members will meet on August 9, 2018 at 3 pm to go over a more detailed discussion on the facilities. This is a multi-step process that will eventually include community members to share in the discussion as well.
- Update Kris Roeseler—Maintenance projects and schedule: Mr.
 Roeseler updated the committee on the ongoing cleaning and maintenance being done in the buildings this summer.
- Parking Lot Maintenance Project: All of the asphalt areas around the school are in need of resurfacing, repair, and re-painting. This project is going to move to full board for approval. Along with the maintenance project, there is a drainage issue at the Jr. Sr. high that will be addressed.
- Custodial Scheduling and Staffing: The custodial crew is currently working shorthanded. The committee discussed how to fill the hours that have been vacated.
- Building level updates: The buildings are being prepped for the start
 of school. Several projects will be completed prior to the beginning of the
 year. The committee requested to get bids on flooring at JHE as well as
 painting projects throughout the district.

- Social Studies Adoption Update: Mrs. Cramer updated the committee
 that the social studies team is moving along with items for next year.
 Some books have been decided others are still being considered. It
 is the goal to order all materials by the last week in July.
- Senior Project Update—2018 and 2019: Mrs. Cramer provided an update on the status of students and their senior projects.
- Math Update: JHE had a three year contract for the math supplies that they have. That three year contract expired and needs to be renewed.
- AP Biology Update: Mrs. Cramer updated the committee on the status of AP Biology. The district is waiting for confirmation on the acceptance of the curriculum.
- JHE Student/Parent Handbook: The committee reviewed and approved of changes made in the elementary handbook.
- Jr./Sr. High Student/Parent Handbook: The committee reviewed and approved of the changes outlined in the Jr./Sr. High handbook.
- Enrollment Projections: Mrs. Cramer updated the committee on enrollment projections at JHE. The district is carefully monitoring numbers in 5K and First grade.
- Annual Notices: The committee reviewed the annual notices being published by the district.
- Kids Club Handbook: The committee reviewed the Kid's Club handbook. The only changes were to dates and calendars within the handbook.

Old Business

- Staff Alternative Compensation Costing: The committee was updated on the initial cost for teacher placement on the alternative compensation schedule.
- 2018-2019 Teacher Contracts: Teacher contracts will be considered at the July board meeting. The teacher contracts would then be sent out immediately following the board meeting if approval is granted.
 2018-2019 Superintendent Contract: The board will review language within the contract in regards to life insurance.

New Business:

- Youth Football: Mr. Falkenthal provided information to Mrs. Cramer about the cost for youth football for 2017-2018. The committee discussed bringing totals to the board to see the full costs from last season. The committee also discussed bringing the program to the school level would provide athletic code oversight that the program currently does not have.
- Parking Lot Maintenance: The committee discussed the drainage issues at the Jr./Sr. high as well as parking lot and drive way and playground surface maintenance that needs to be done. The committee recommended moving the bids to the board for approval.
- Athletic Trainer Contract: The athletic trainer contract through Froedtert remains the same as last year.
- Leasing Options for District Copy Machines and Printing: The district lease for copy machine maintenance is up; options were reviewed at the committee level. A recommendation will go to the board to renew

- the lease with Ross Imaging and upgrade the copy machines this year to receive guaranteed pricing on copies.
- Bus Contract 2018-2020: The committee reviewed the information from Schultz Bus Company.
- Milk Bid: The committee reviewed the bid by Kemps from Cedarburg. This is the only bid received and is the same company that has served our food service program in the past.
- CESA Contract Services 2018-2019: Mrs. Cramer updated the committee on the CESA contract for 2018-2019. The contract itself went down but it is due to some changes in services provided. The board will have an agenda item for approval.
- 2018-2019 School Fees: The committee reviewed school fees for both buildings at the meeting. There were some suggested updates to fees for students at the Jr./Sr. high but none at the elementary.
- 2018-2019 Athletic Passes: The committee discussed the idea of restructuring athletic passes for the upcoming school year. The committee would like to see passes be year-long and include a family option. The committee also discussed allowing high school students into home games free of charge with their student ID.
- Insurance and Benefit Update: Mrs. Cramer provided a brief update that the tone is overall satisfied with the insurance change.
- Educational Assistant Compensation: Mrs. Cramer is seeking input from committees and the board of education in the review of compensation for our educational assistants.
- Food Service Program: Mrs. Cramer updated the committee on the candidate search for a food service assistant and manager.
- 2018-2019 Funding Projection: Mr. Kiefer provided the preliminary projection in which the district saw a decrease of about \$2,000 from last year.

The Hustisford Public Schools will be conducting an early childhood developmental screening for all children:

*born between September 1, 2015 and September 1, 2016 AND

*currently residing in the Hustisford School District (Any district child between the ages of 2-4 is welcome to participate)

The Hustisford School District is collaborating with the Hustisford Community Library during preschool library time to provide early childhood screening. Parents with children between the ages of 2-3 that are listed on the district census will be mailed an Age and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) to complete and return to the school.

Parents will have an opportunity to meet with school professionals to review aspects of their child's developmental progress and to determine if there are needs for any further evaluation or intervention. Information regarding community resources will also be provided.

It is important that parents not receiving a questionnaire through the US mail, contact Renee Donegon at John Hustis Elementary School to receive information and a questionnaire for the screening by October 12. Parents can contact John Hustis Elementary School at 920.349.3228 between the hours of 7:30AM and 3:00PM.

If you and your child are unable to attend the preschool library hour on Oct. 17, please contact Terri Kreitzman, Director of Special Education or Dena Serwe, School Psychologist at 349-3261 if you have concerns or questions about your child's development.

NOTICE OF CHILD FIND ACTIVITY

The Hustisford School District is required to locate, identify, and evaluate all resident children with disabilities, including children with disabilities attending private schools in the school district, and homeless children. The process of locating, identifying, and evaluating children with disabilities is known as child find.

This agency conducts the following child find activities each year. Developmental screening of preschool children is conducted with the use of Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ-3) and developmental checklists to help track of children's development. The questionnaire includes questions about children's communication, gross motor, fine motor, problem solving, & personalsocial skills. Information is used to provide the parent with a profile of their child's current development and to provide suggestions for follow-up activities. Professionals are available to discuss the questionnaire and observe children at scheduled preschool screening opportunities 2-3 times per year. The information from screening is also used to determine whether a child should be evaluated for a suspected disability. When school staff reasonably believes a child is a child with a disability, they refer the child for evaluation by a school district Individualized Education Program (IEP) team. Dates for screening opportunities will be posted in local newspapers and the district newsletter. Universal screening tools and RtI practices are used to screen and monitor school age children.

This notice informs parents of the records the school district will develop and maintain as part of its child find activities. This notice also informs parents of their rights regarding any records developed.

The school district gathers personally identifiable information on any child who participates in child find activities. Parents, teachers, and other professionals provide information to the school related to the child's academic performance, behavior, and health. This information is used to determine whether the child needs special education services. Personally identifiable information directly related to a child and maintained by the school is a pupil record. Pupil records include records maintained in any way including, but not limited to, computer storage media, video, and audiotape, film, microfilm, and microfiche. Records maintained for personal use by a teacher and not available to others and records available only to persons involved in the psychological treatment of a child are **not** pupil records.

The school district maintains several classes of pupil records.

- "Progress records" include grades, courses the child has taken, the child's attendance record, immunization records, required lead screening records, and records of school extra-curricular activities. Progress records must be maintained for at least five years after the child ceases to be enrolled.
- "Behavioral records" include such records as psychological tests, personality evaluations, records of conversations, written statements relating specifically to the pupil's behavior, tests relating specifically to achievement or measurement of ability, physical health records other than immunization and lead screening records, law enforcement officers' records, and other pupil records that are not "progress records." Law enforcement officers' records are maintained separately from other pupil records. Behavioral records may be maintained for no longer than one year after the child graduates or otherwise ceases to be enrolled, unless the parent specifies in writing that the records may be maintained for a longer period of time. The school district informs parent when pupil records are no longer needed to provide special education. At the request of the child's parents, the school district destroys the information that is no longer needed.
- "Directory data" includes the student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, photographs, degrees and awards received and the name of the school most recently previously attended by the student.
- "Pupil physical health records" include basic health information about a
 pupil, including the pupil's immunization records, an emergency medical card, a log of first aid and medicine administered to the pupil, an
 athletic permit card, a record concerning the pupil's ability to

Participate in an education program, any required lead screening records, the results of any routine screening test, such as for hearing, vision or scoliosis, and any follow-up to the test, and any other basic health information, as determined by the state superintendent. Any pupil record relating to a pupil's physical health that is not a pupil physical health record is treated as a patient health care record under sections 146.81 to 146.84, Wisconsin Statutes. Any pupil record concerning HIV testing is treated as provided under section 252.15, Wisconsin Statutes.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and Section 118.125, Wisconsin Statutes, afford parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") the following rights with respect to education records:

- The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the receipt of the request. Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where file records may be inspected. The school district will comply with the request without unnecessary delay and before any meeting about an individualized education program, or any due process hearing, and in no case more than 45 days after the request has been made. If any record includes information on more than one child, the parents of those children have the right to inspect and review only the information about their child or to be informed of that specific information. Upon request, the school district will give a parent or eligible student a copy of the behavioral records. Upon request, the school district will give the parent or eligible student a list of the types and locations of education records collected, maintained, or used by the district for special education. The school district will respond to reasonable requests for explanations and interpretations of the records. A representative of the parent may inspect and review the records.
- The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes is inaccurate or misleading. Parents or eligible students may ask the Hustisford School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the district decides not to amend the record, the district will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
 - The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA and state law authorize disclosure without consent. The exceptions are states in 34 CFR 99.31 and section 118.125(2)(a) to (m) and sub. (2m), Wisconsin Statutes. One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosures to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board; a person or company with whom the district has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the district discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. Also the district discloses "directory data" without consent, unless the parent notifies the district that it may not be released without prior parental consent.

The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the District to comply with the requirements of FERPA. Annual Notice of Special Education Referral and Evaluation Procedures

Upon request, The Hustisford School District is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individual Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies and evaluates all children who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools, and secondary schools located in the school district

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to report the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made. The referral must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. Special Education: Special Needs Scholarship Program (SNSP)

The Special Needs Scholarship Program (SNSP) allows a student with a disability who meets certain eligibility requirements to receive a state-funded scholarship to attend a participating private school. The Special Needs Scholarship Program is governed by Wisconsin Statue 115.7915 and Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter PI 49. Additional information about the program is available on the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction website.

Student Assessment Information

Parents of students attending any school receiving Title I program funds may request information regarding any state or local school district policy regarding student participation in any assessments mandated by law and by the District. Parents may excuse their child from taking the state-mandated examinations in grades 4, 8, 9, 10, and 11. There is no parental right to opt their child out of the civics test required for high school graduation under Section 118.33(1m) of the State Statutes

Directory Data/Information

The Board designates as student "directory data/information": a student's name; address; telephone number; date and place of birth; photograph; major field of study; participation in officially-recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; dates of attendance; school attended, date of graduation; or awards received.

Except as otherwise provided, directory data may be disclosed to any person (other parents, planning parties, post-secondary institutions, military recruiters, etc.) after the school has: (a) notified the adult student or parent, legal guardian or guardian ad litem of a minor student of the categories of information which it has designated as directory data with respect to each student, (b) informed such persons that they have 14 days to inform the school that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without their prior consent, and (c) allowed 14 days for such persons to inform the school, in writing, of all the directory data items they refuse to permit the District to designate as directory data about that student. The District will not release directory data earlier than 14 days after the initial written notice to the adult student or parent or guardian or after the District has been restricted from doing so by any of those parties. This notice serves as notification of the District's plan to release directory data as permitted in this policy. (School Board Policy - 8330)

Education of Homeless Children

The McKinney-Vento Act defines homeless children and youth as:

- · Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:
- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- living in emergency or transitional shelters
- abandoned in hospitals
- living in a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
- migratory children who qualify as homeless because the children are living in circumstances described above
