


Mr. Jacquart's careers class is bringing in local companies to speak to students about job opportunities, types of industries in the area, and what it takes to be a good employee. Integrated Physics and Chemistry (IPC) students have been busy learning about different topics through the lens of chemistry, physics and earth science. In the last unit, students investigate water and how its properties lend to life on earth as well as all the incredible things it can do! After a brief refresher on the scientific method, students are starting to learn about

chemical reactions. To do so, they had to understand bonding. One useful application of metallic bonding is the creation of special mixtures called "alloys". Students made brass by using pennies, zinc, and heat. First, they made "silver" pennies and then they turned them into "gold", just as the alchemists of the middle ages. Would the gold or silver pennies fool you?


Opportunity Recap
