


## **Classroom Spotlights**

Vet Science students have been busy performing physical exams on Ms. Novak's dog, Cia. Animal Production is building animal facility dioramas. Food Science students are getting ready to make their final recipes for their final project.











Advanced Composition students explored ideas about censorship and technology use while reading *Fahrenheit 451*. They debated which theme was more prevalent in the book. English 11 students explored how to use different types of media to publish their work. They learned how to interview someone and created a *Humans of Husty* podcast episode. The class then practiced how to write a review using their classmates' recorded episodes. English 10 wrote argumentative letters using a children's book for inspiration. They had to write from the antagonist's perspective arguing against being punished for their actions in the book. English 9 students explored their creativity while writing their own locked room murder mysteries. They used the book read in class as inspiration for how to weave together their clues to not give away the murderer before the ending.
