A Message from the Superintendent...

First and foremost, let me take this opportunity to wish you a Happy New Year. Within the District we are continuously looking for ways to make improvements to what we do. We will be making some changes to our newsletter in the coming months. This is the last monthly newsletter that you will be receiving from the District. The newsletters will start to come to you quarterly. You will receive the next newsletter at the end of third quarter which is in March. You will then receive a newsletter at the end of the school year. The newsletters will no longer have the school board meeting minutes printed in them. Rather, you will be able to access the minutes via the District website at www.hustisford.k12.wi.us. If you do not have access to the internet, you may stop by the District office to request a typed copy of the minutes. Starting with the 2019-2020 school year, you will continue to receive a quarterly newsletter from the District, but you will see some drastic changes occur with the newsletter that you receive. We will be sending you out a newsletter that will include all of the valuable information that you need to stay informed plus information about our students and what is happening with them in our schools. We hope that these changes will excite you as much as they have us. I know that some of you will miss the monthly newsletter, but as with any change you will get use to the new schedule and the exciting information that we get out to you. I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by President John Bohonek at 6:30 p.m.

II. Roll call of members

Board members signed the attendance roster at the start of the meeting. Members present: Jay Behnke, Dave Stryck, Tracy Malterer, John Bohonek, Steve Weinheimer, and Barb May. Absent: Lisa Bosse (excused)

III. Verification of public notice: Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

IV. Public Forum: None

V. Consent Agenda

VII. Reports

A. Citizen of the Month: Klaire Her and Koltin Her were honored from JHE. Sophia Hamden was honored from the HS and Alivia Beisbier was honored for the MS.

B. Principals' Reports:

Mr. Bushey Reported: Mr. Bushey was not present, a verbal report was not given. The board was provided a written report.

Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported that students continue to earn their "Bee" tickets for positive behavior. Family Fun Night on October 31 was a success. A Community Appreciation Day was held during American Education Week and several community members attended and enjoyed coffee, cookies, and conversation. Students are busy making ornaments for the village tree. Kohl's Wild Theater will be at school on November 20. The JHE winter concert is December 13.

C. Athletic Director's Report: Winter sports are underway. There are 2 teams for girls' basketball and three at times for boys. There are currently 8 students out for wrestling.

D. Financial Director's Report: Mr. Kiefer reported on the various DPI reports that have been completed. He attended a Baird Model training to assist with budget projections. He updated the board on the various bids that are out currently on projects for both buildings. He provided the board a written statement of accounts as well.

E. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported on various meetings she attended throughout the month including meetings for insurance and mental health. She complimented the JHE staff on their nice community event that they held. She complimented Mr. White and the kitchen staff for their hardwork over the past several weeks. She discussed the Veteran's Day assembly which had a very nice community turn-out. She provided updates on

upcoming events throughout the district. December 3, is the first round of Senior Project presentations, December 11, the Community Library is hosting an open house, December 13 is the JHE Winter concert and December 18 is the MS/HS concert. Mrs. Cramer thanked the board for their dedication to students and the administrators, teachers, and staff members for their work and dedication each day.

VIII. Board Development:

- A. State Report Cards: Mrs. Cramer updated the board on the state district report cards. The district met all expectations. Both schools also fell into the category of meeting expectations. Mrs. Cramer discussed concerns in the area of reading at JHE. She also discussed concerns with closing achievement gaps and ensuring that all students are receiving interventions needed. She discussed that several of the initiatives have addressed the area of math. The schools have seen positive growth. Intervention needs to be a focus in both buildings. Teachers need to be held accountable for what and who they are teaching.
- B. State Education Convention: Mrs. Cramer and the board discussed the State Education Convention and who would be attending so that registration can take place and the early bird discount would apply.

New Business:

- **Update Kris Roeseler—Maintenance projects and schedule**: Mr. Roeseler updated the board on the various projects being completed throughout the district. Mr. Roeseler indicated that he worked with Food Service Director, Jason White on a thorough cleaning of the kitchen storage area. He is working on the shed and prepping the items outdoors for winter. He will be winterizing the concession stand and cleaning around JHE to get hoses and other gardening items in for the winter. There are boiler issues at JHE. Johnson Controls is working with the district to figure out the issues. There are compressor issues at the HS with the air conditioning unit. This is a warranty fix and will be completed soon. The storage area for wrestling has been redone. The grease trap in the kitchen needs to be repaired and Mr. Roeseler is working on that project. There will be items that maintenance and kitchen staff will place on the Wisconsin Auction site.
- **Kitchens Update Bids**: Mr. White has gathered bids for new shelving to meet code in the kitchen. He also has secured a bid for a new 10-burner stove that will be sought through a grant process with DPI. He also is working to update several workstations to bring them to code.
- **Potential Projects at Jr./Sr. High and JHE**: The district will be seeking bids to complete tiling at JHE. The two northern hallways are still carpeted and need to be tiled. The district would love to see this project happen over the Christmas break.
- **Unesco**: Unesco has the pricing ready for the facility study. Mrs. Cramer will work to secure them to present the information at a board meeting.

New Business:

- Budget Update—Mr. Kiefer updated the committee that grant claims are being processed. He also updated that the large purchases, server update and parking lot repair, have been paid.
- Line of Credit continuation with Hustisford State Bank—Mr. Kiefer will have the documents ready for renewal on the line of credit with Hustisford State Bank for the November board meeting. The district did not utilize the line of credit this past year and it is predicting that it will not be needed again, however, it is good to have for cash flow if payments are delayed or do not match payroll deadlines.
- Kitchen Projects at HS—Mr. White has gathered bids for new shelving to meet code in the kitchen. He also has secured a bid for a new 10-burner stove that will be sought through a grant process with DPI. He also is working to update several workstations to bring them to code.
- Building Improvement Projects at JHE and HS/MS-- The district will be seeking bids to complete tiling at JHE. The two northern hallways are still carpeted and need to be tiled. The district would love to see this project happen over the Christmas break. Mrs. Cramer also discussed a complete gym floor refinish during the summer of 2019 including complete sand down of the wood surface and repainting and refinishing. She also wants to seek bids to replace the bleachers in the gym at the HS as the current bleachers are having issues and are not repairable in some places.
- Hire for kitchen assistant—The district is still seeking to hire a food service assistant for the HS.
- Athletic Director Contract—The committee discussed the athletic director contract and the compensation received. It is the committee's recommendation to look at an incremental increase over the next three years to bring the compensation comparable to surrounding districts.

Greetings from Jr./Sr. High School Principal Mr. Clint Bushey

Greetings Hustisford Jr. / Sr. High School Families,

The school year is nearing the halfway point. It is really inspiring watching the students grow and develop into outstanding young individuals. I am very proud of the progress we have made as a school so far this year. Throughout the school year I have witnessed some very awesome skills, abilities, and talents from our students. I feel very blessed to be working with these students and staff. It is my hope that the students and families had an enjoyable and relaxing Holiday season.

As the first semester comes to a close on January 17th, students may experience an increase in their stress levels. Students need to understand that stress is a normal part of life and they must learn to find appropriate ways to respond to stress. Amy Lukowski, PsyD identified these seven ways to deal with stress that you can share with your children:

1. Keep a positive attitude – sometimes the way you think about things can make all of the difference. Your attitude can help offset difficult situations.
2. Accept that there are events you cannot control – when you know there are times when you have given all that you can to a situation, it allows you to expend energy where it can be more effective.
3. Learn to relax – purposeful relaxation, such as deep breathing, muscle relaxation and meditation is essential in training your body to relax. Relaxation should be a part of your daily regimen.
4. Be active regularly – being active also helps your body more easily fight stress because it is fit.
5. Eat well-balanced meals – staying on track with healthy eating habits is a great way to manage stress.
6. Rest and sleep - your body needs time to recover from stressful events, so sleep is an important part of caring for yourself.
7. Find your stressors and effective ways to cope with them - remember that you can learn to control stress because stress comes from how you respond to stressful events.

Another area that students have a difficult time with is coping. Students struggle to effectively handle and deal with problems, situations with friends, and social media. The Cleveland Clinic listed some common coping mechanisms to help students learn strategies to cope with their problems and situations. These common coping mechanisms include:

1. Lowering your expectations
2. Asking others to help or assist you

3. Taking responsibility for the situation
4. Engaging in problem solving
5. Maintaining emotionally supportive relationships
6. Maintaining emotional composure or, alternatively, expressing distressing emotions
7. Challenging previously held beliefs that are no longer adaptive
8. Directly attempting to change the source of stress
9. Distancing yourself from the source of stress
10. Experts agree that coping is a process rather than an event. Thus, an individual may alternate between several of the above coping strategies in order to cope with a stressful event.

It is my hope that you share these strategies with your children when they are feeling stressed or having a difficult time coping with a situation in their lives. With your guidance and support they can learn and develop strategies to handle situations when you are not present.

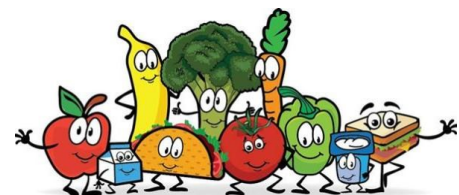
SCHOOL BREAKFAST AND LUNCH A LA CARTE

The school breakfast program now offers hot lunch for students 6-12 Monday through Friday 7:00am-7:45am. Students can have 1 hot breakfast item along with 1 fruit juice or other fruit alternative and a milk to be in compliant with the reimbursable breakfast program. If the student wants just the hot breakfast with no fruit juice box or fruit then it will be considered an a la Carte item and their account will be charged \$2.00.

NEW: A la Carte before school and during lunch is being offered to students 6-12th grades for an extra cost of .50 cents or \$1.00 in addition to the hot lunch offered. Students can purchase on their accounts additional items that are "health snack" compliant to the school nutrition program. If a student's account is in the negative, the student will NOT be able to purchase a la carte until that balance is paid up.
