March Madness Classroom Spotlight

March Madness is upon us and what a great way to add energy and variety to the classroom than to fill out brackets! Filling out brackets isn't just fun, it helps students learn different skills, regardless of the subject matter. Students have to use research and data analysis and then decision-making skills to determine a winner. In the process, they learn how to debate, support a claim, and justify their picks. In addition, students learn how to engage in respectful interactions and collaboration while building a sense of community in the classroom. See how Hustisford teachers are using brackets to enhance their lessons this March!

During the month of March all of the Spanish classes take a break from their normal warm-ups in order to do a March madness bracket. Every Wednesday in Spanish class students get to listen to a new Spanish language song in order to practice their listening skills. During March all of the songs they've listened to go into a bracket and each class votes between two songs each day. The last day of school before spring break is when they vote for the final song. Students also have the option of having their own personal bracket.

March Madness began in the HS Science department this month! All high school science students are participating in March Mammal Madness, sponsored by Arizona State University. Their brackets, though, look a little bit different. Students had to research different organisms in different habitats to see who





would beat each other in a face-off. ASU is releasing videos throughout the following weeks to tell us which organism wins and why. Students are competing for the top points in the school, the top average for a class, and the "Beat Mrs.Schall" awards. Sound like fun? It is! But filling out brackets like these also provides valuable learning opportunities for students, including researching, decision-making, and argumentation (in addition to the content being learned).

English 10 also participated in March Madness while learning about poetry. They learned vocabulary words about poetry before analyzing poems to see which one approached the elements better. They focused on the tone and mood of the poems the first round. The second round they critiqued how well the poem communicated the subject and theme. The third round had them breaking apart the poetic techniques of the poems. In the fourth and final round, they relooked at all three focuses in the final two poems.
