Superintendent's Annual Report to the Board of Education and Community

Dear School Board Members and Members of the Hustisford School District Community:

I want to start out this evening by saying thank you for the opportunity provided to me to serve as the superintendent of schools for the Hustisford School District. I am humbled and honored to work for this community. The unwavering dedication to your school and most of all our students is what makes this community unique. I have the privilege each day to work with individuals who are dedicated to our students. Thank you to the Board of Education for supporting the great work being done by our staff and supporting the education of our students, your support is noted and appreciated.

Our school year has started with many different initiatives being worked on. Some of these initiatives have caused challenges for us. Although we know that we will face challenges throughout the year, we will work together to meet these challenges and always make decisions with our students in mind. Although these challenges arise, they will be met with many successes that we, as a district, can celebrate. I am excited about what is happening in this district and the challenges and celebrations that we have.

I want to take a moment to outline initiatives that the board

and community have invested in that have had or will have a long-lasting impact on our students.



There have been several curricular changes that have occurred this year. The Sr. High is offering classes through the math

department that are credit options through both Moraine Park and UW-Oshkosh. This will allow students taking certain classes to gain credits for post-secondary education prior to even beginning. We are working on a complete science adoption for the upcoming year. New science materials will be researched and purchased for all grade levels. There were updates to the Spanish department as well providing students with novels for class to more closely match the new foreign language standards adopted in Wisconsin. The board voted to add a full-time interventionist at John Hustis Elementary, providing students with the extra support needed to succeed in school. Social Emotional based curricular materials have been provided for all staff and students K-12. This curriculum provides a much needed foundation for social emotional growth across the district. The district continues to provide small class sizes at John Hustis as well, emphasizing the importance of relationship building and a strong basis for their 13 years in the district. The board supported an extra day of time for our School Resource Officer. We are blessed to have a school resource officer here 3 days per week to build relationships with students and work to ensure safe schools. There are several high school students who are enrolled in the start college now options offered through the WI technical college system. Finally, the district started an Early Childhood Special Education program. The district is offering services to students ages 3-5 who qualify for special services. In the past the students attended another district and then came back at the age of 4. We now are able to offer services in-house to help keep our youngest, most vulnerable learners here within the district. The MS/HS has also

adopted a new research based intervention program for students performing below grade level. Students receive intervention from classroom teachers to help them get the extra boost needed. There is a lot going on in our schools. Our teachers are being faced with new challenges, but our students are getting the most up-to-date rigor in curriculum that will help them to be successful into the future. Several projects were recently completed and in the process of being completed for the district. Most noticeably, the HS gym floor was completely resurfaced. New bleachers are scheduled to be installed in the HS gym shortly as well as new end mats. The updates provided a fresh look to the gym and provided much needed safety updates for fans and athletes. New technology upgrades were completed on the security camera system, phone system and computers and new devices were purchased for students and staff. A new touch-interactive screen was installed in the HS science lab to help students get more hands-on, realistic experience that cannot be replicated in a classroom setting. Our new server update was completed over the summer as well providing us with ample storage now and into the future. A new laser cutter was purchased for the technology education program to complete our Fab Lab for the MS/HS students. A new computer lab was created using space in the current library. This allows all teachers to have access to the lab throughout the 8-hour day. This equipment provides opportunities for students that will help them to be successful in post-secondary education and the work force. New doors were installed on the south side of JHE and the front entrance. The doors that were replaced were in need of repair and will now provide a more secure environment for our students. A project was done on the north wall of the HS to help remediate a leakage issue that occurred. Several areas were painted over the summer to provide a fresh look to classrooms and other spaces in both buildings. New flooring was installed in hallways at JHE late last year and new flooring was installed in one classroom this summer.

Our buildings continue to age. We have done several improvements throughout each building, but as our systems age, inevitably pieces start to fail. We currently engaging in a Citizen's Advisory Committee to help gauge the life of the buildings and seek public input of where the district should go next in regards to facilities. The ways in which children are educated has caused space issues in both buildings. Teachers are being asked to be creative with the spaces that they have. We have teachers in each building teaching classes in conference room sized spaces. We have art in the cafeteria once again at JHE. We have creatively made space for students, but the challenge that we face is as we add more programming and students, our buildings cannot support it. The board and community are faced with this issue over and over. We will be forced once again to make

budgetary decisions for our aging buildings. We will continue to maintain and do projects.

The district is moving forward and facing the challenges with great determination. We want to make Hustisford competitive and make our students high achieving, high functioning citizens. We have so much to be proud of. I ask for continued support from our community. I ask for our community to come and see what we are all about and what we have to offer. I am very proud to be here serving the district and the children. It is always a great day to be a falcon. #HUSTYPROUD

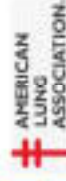

A Letter From The JR/SR High School Principal

This Countries Vaping Epidemic

The News and Governmental Agencies are finally catching up to the epidemic that has impacted so many in our country. The large tobacco companies have found a new approach to introduce today's youth to Nicotine. Vaping was introduced as an alternative to smoking for adults looking to quit smoking cigarettes. Or so they claimed, if that was their sole intention then why do they market candy flavored cartridges? Why is the packaging for these cartridges targeted to young children? Why is the advertising techniques used geared towards younger viewers?

We as a school district, like so many others, are doing everything we can not to have this impact the education of your child. We desperately need your help! Vaping with electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes) has now contributed to 37 deaths in the U.S. as of October 31, according to a new report from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). As I was writing this article I had to change the number from 34 to 37 in a matter of a couple hours. This is real and this is scary. Fortunately in my career here, I have witnessed a steady decline in cigarette use among Middle and High School age students. Unfortunately, I now am seeing all those gains made in reducing Nicotine use and dependence change to a dramatic and steady rise in use of vaping products. All the positive gains are rapidly going away.

We have taken steps at school for several years to educate students on the dangers and lifelong health consequences vaping can cause. Material and information has been added to many curriculums to increase awareness and to educate students. Classroom projects and anti-vaping campaigns have been displayed throughout the school. Staff has been educated by the American Lung Association on product identification, dangers, and warning signs of use. The American Lung Association will be presenting to Parents and community members in the near future through the Community Education program. Administration has been attending Dodge County Coalition meetings to discuss with other Schools, County officials, Law Enforcement, and community leaders ways to help curb the epidemic in our area. These meetings have provided us with an insight on how widespread this problem is and the impact it is having on today's youth.

Vape devices come in all shapes and sizes and are very easily hidden. The cartridges that contain the fluid are small and at times look like flash drives or phone charging devices. Please talk to your child about vaping, the dangers, and lifelong consequences this terrible habit can cause. These are difficult conversations but your child's health and future is worth it. I have included in this article a couple of websites that you can use as resources.

By working together, educating, and having those difficult conversations we can have an impact on your child's future. Thank you for all you do and thank you for your help in this matter.

In the past year, Superintendent Cramer and the District team have collaborated with the Board of Education to improve academic curricula, increase early childhood education components, add research-based intervention programs, and increase options for earned credits with technical schools and four-year colleges.

The Hustisford School District also has a strong Community Education program – where public education goes beyond a K-12 framework and residents of all ages and addresses participate in programs and activities that enhance the quality of life in our community. The District also works to strengthen the school-community relationship with the addition of a School Resource Officer, in partnership with the Village of Hustisford. The elementary school's Parent-Teacher Committee (PTC), the Hustisford Booster Club, Sinissippi Rec Department, the Hustisford Wrestling Club, Hustisford Business Association, and Hustisford Community Library are just a few examples of groups who cooperatively engage District youth, families, and staff for the betterment of our community. The Hustisford School District is the lifeblood that flows through the Village and surrounding Townships of Hustisford, Hubbard, Lebanon, Clyman, and Rubicon.

Last year, the District conducted a Facilities Study of both school buildings. The study told us what the Board and Administration already know – the physical needs of our District buildings require improvement in school safety and security, HVAC and electrical systems, and learning and community spaces. The physical needs in our District are no small challenges. In July 2019, a Citizens Advisory Committee organized and meets monthly to analyze and prioritize the direction for future projects to District buildings. The Citizen's Advisory Committee will make their recommendation to the Board of Education in 2020.
