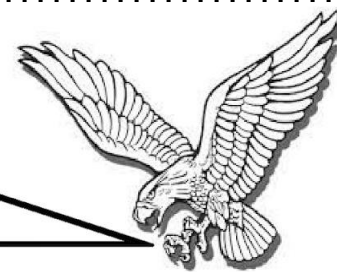

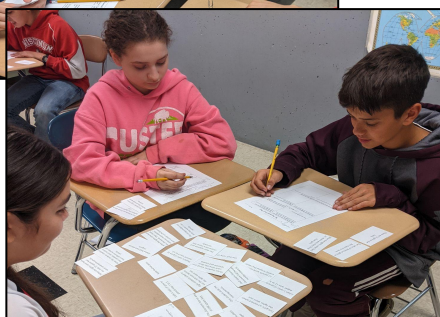
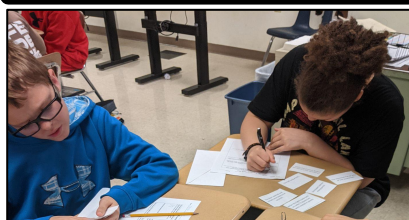

Classroom Spotlights

The Senior High Choir class is off to a great start this year. We started the year working on our intonation and unison singing. We were working hard to sound like one voice in the choir. Recently we have begun working hard at harmonies as we prepare for the Veteran's Day assembly in November. We started by singing simple rounds and then began singing more difficult parts as we progressed. The students also tried singing their parts in a circle, singing in a round we call it, so that they would be able to hear their own parts as well as the other parts in the choir. As we polish our performance we will begin focusing on dynamics and expression so that we can make our performance more interesting to the audience. These skills will help as we move forward and begin to start preparing our music for the upcoming winter concert in December.



7th grade math students have been looking at tables and graphs to see if they are proportional or non proportional. They are setting up rates and seeing if they all have a constant rate of change. They have done some in class activities in groups as well as homework to practice finding a constant rate of change and that led to their group project of using proportions to find a pencil thief. Students were in groups and they each got an envelope of clues. They had to decide what information was important and what was not before they set up proportions and solved for more information. Each clue would help them answer the next until they found out who stole the pencils. Teams did great problem solving and talking out the clues and their detective work led them to the thief!

In October, the focus was on perspective taking and respect in the classroom. Teachers encouraged students to express differing viewpoints while fostering empathy. Teachers were urged to create safe spaces in their classrooms for students to share opinions through activities like group discussions, physical positioning on topics, or class polls. Students were also taught that respectful engagement is also key, with organized debates, opinion sharing, and lessons on how to respond kindly to differing views. The hope is that students use these skills to have positive interactions with their peers.
