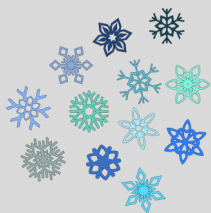
child brings energy and excitement through our doors. Of course there are challenges that we all face, but we work through them together. It takes all of us and you to help each child succeed.

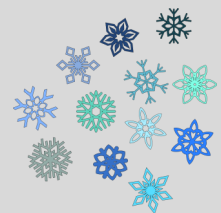

I. Call to order

The meeting was called to order by President Dave Strysick at 6:30 p.m.

II. Roll call of members

Board members signed the attendance roster at the start of the meeting. Members present: Jay Behnke, Dave Strysick, Tracy Malterer, Steve Weinheimer (entered meeting at 6:46 p.m.), Lisa Bosse, Barb May, and John Bohonek.

III. Verification of public notice: Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

V. Consent Agenda

VII. Reports

A. Monthly Student Recognition: Megan Promersberger, First Grade, JHE; Dyson Kadinger, Fourth Grade, JHE; Laura Greeb, Senior; and Chellie Hildebrandt, Seventh Grade were all recognized for outstanding citizenship for the month of November.

B. Principals' Reports:

Ms. Bell Reported: Students continue to earn their tickets for good behavior. Staff members are working diligently on educator effectiveness. PTC held a family fun night on October 31. Students participated in an assembly for Veteran's Day as well as an assembly with Kohl's Wild Theater. The Winter Concert for JHE is on December 14th at 6:30pm.

Mr. Bushey Reported: Mr. Bushey reported NHS induction of 8 new members. Kevin Hines presented to the student body and the students did great during the assembly. The school drama production is on December 9 at 7 and December 10 at 2. Senior Project presentations will be on December 11. The Jr./Sr. High winter concert is December 19 at 7 pm.

C. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal reported on upcoming winter sports numbers. Girls' basketball has 17 out. The high school boys have 25 players out. Wrestling currently has 6 athletes participating. Each of the boys' teams in grades 5-8 will have their own team this year. The girls will be a 5/6 split and a 7/8 split.

D. Financial Director's Report: Mr. John Kiefer updated the board on the current account balances and budget views. He provided information on the training sessions that he has attended to learn more about Skyward. He generated reports for the board to view. He also updated the board on the various reports that have been submitted to DPI.

E. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported that the administration team worked with CESA 6 on the beginning stages of the strategic plan. Mrs. Cramer updated on the various meetings she has attended with area administrators and emergency management. She also updated on how the district is preparing for the upcoming winter in regards to emergency preparedness.

VIII. Board Development:

A. Presentation by students for Art Club: Two young ladies presented on the art club that has been started at the Jr./Sr. high. The art club meets at least

once a month and is open to all students. The club supervisor is Ms. Rennhack.

- B. Ag Education Discussion:** The board discussed the future of Ag. Education at Hustisford. They discussed second semester programming options that would be available online as well as the options for FFA. They discussed that next year it is a goal to hire a teacher who could fulfill an ag/science need within the district. They also discussed the importance of keeping Fay Hildebrandt at the FFA advisor and complimented her on a job well done with the program.
- C. Discussion in regards to CNC Milling Machine Donation:** Mrs. Cramer updated the board that Signicast out of Hartford is interested in donating a CNC Milling Machine to the tech ed. department. The machine will come and be set up and fully functional from the company. The board accepted that there is some liability involved, but is grateful for the purchase.
- D. Custodial Services Discussion:** Mrs. Cramer updated the board on the potential need for additional custodial hours during the day at the Jr./Sr. high. The board indicated that they would further discuss options at the December board meeting.

- **Update from Kris Roeseler – Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds:** Mr. Roeseler provided an update in regards to what has been accomplished in regards to maintenance. He is working on prepping for winter in many different ways. He also provided a list of items that he is continuing to work on throughout the year.

New Business:

- **Facility Planning presentation from Unesco:** Unesco provided a presentation to the committee on facility planning and what their company can do for the district. The company provides a complete analysis of our facilities from mechanicals to educational spaces. They will then analyze the information and provide the district with sound information on replacement, life expectancy, and planning solutions. The committee would like to discuss this further with the board and potentially bring in a presentation later this year.
- **CNC Mill Donation:** The committee received information from Mr. Jasper on a CNC Mill that Signacast is looking into donating to the district. The board will discuss this at the full board meeting.
- **Possible projects:** The committee reviewed a bid received on locks and rekeying for the entire district. The locks are getting worn and they are challenging to use with the master keys.

He also provided an update that the district was able to secure several very nice computers from MPTC. They will be used to replace outdated computers within the classrooms at JHE.

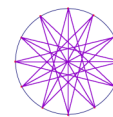

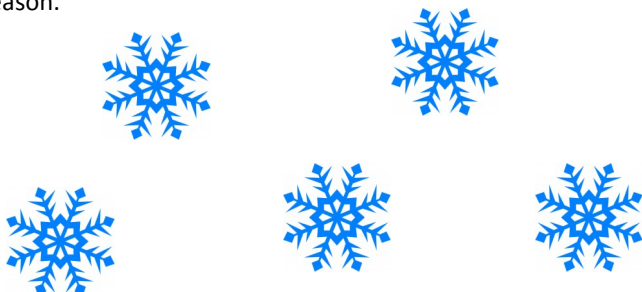
