
for all! The team plays all home games at Wild Goose Park in Juneau.

**I. Call to order**

The meeting was called to order by President Dave Strysick at 6:30 p.m.

**II. Roll call of members**

Board members signed the attendance roster at the start of the meeting. Members present: Jay Behnke, Dave Strysick, Tracy Malterer, Steve Weinheimer, Lisa Bosse, and John Bohonek. Barb May was absent.

**III. Verification of public notice:** Heather Cramer, superintendent of schools, verified that the meeting was noticed to the public appropriately as required by S. 19.84 (1), (2), (3), & (4) Wis. Stats.

**IV. Public Forum:** No one present.

**V. Consent Agenda**

**VII. Reports**

A. Principals' Reports: Ms. Bell Reported: Ms. Bell reported on the second session of summerschool and that current enrollment is 98 students. She also reported on the progress of building cleaning. She provided information on registration and projected enrollment. Finally, she reported on the new laptops being purchased for the library at JHE for student use.

Mr. Bushey Reported: No report was given.

B. Athletic Director's Report: Mr. Falkenthal reported that the athletic code meeting is being held on July 30 at 7:00 pm. Football starts August 1 and Volleyball and Soccer start on August 14.

C. Superintendent's Report: Mrs. Cramer reported on the current state of hiring in the district. She reported on the administrative team's attendance at a meeting discussing emergency procedures for the district. She updated the board on the projects being completed within the buildings. She also congratulated all of the students that worked hard over the summer in athletics in various programs throughout the state.

**VIII. Board Development:**

A. Employee Alternative Compensation Plan: The school district attorney presented information to the board on compensation plans. He provided information on the pros and cons of the plans and what is going on throughout the state.

B. Strategic Planning: Mrs. Cramer provided the board with the information about the process and the board decided to continue the conversation into next month.

C. Goal Setting: The board discussed three topic areas that will be addressed in the district level goals. The first goal is related to implementing a strategic plan. The board is committed to the implementation of the plan and the process involved. The second goal will focus on the recognition of teachers and staff. Finally, the board would like to see some more student governance presence with the board.

D. JHE Enrollment and Staffing: The board discussed the projected enrollment at JHE. The decision was made to post 2 new teaching positions. One will fill the vacancy left by Peggy Bell, the other is a newly created position to accom-

modate larger class sizes. The district will also fill the elementary library aide position.





## Attendance at Athletic Events

Elementary and Middle School Students must be accompanied by and under the direct supervision of a parent or appropriate adult throughout the athletic event. This will ensure a safe environment.

## Directory Data

The Board designates as student "directory data/information": a student's name; address; telephone number; date and place of birth; photograph; major field of study; participation in officially-recognized activities and sports; height and weight, if a member of an athletic team; dates of attendance; school attended, date of graduation; or awards received.

Except as otherwise provided, directory data may be disclosed to any person (other parents, planning parties, post-secondary institutions, military recruiters, etc.) after the school has: (a) notified the adult student or parent, legal guardian or guardian ad litem of a minor student of the categories of information which it has designated as directory data with respect to each student, (b) informed such persons that they have 14 days to inform the school that all or any part of the directory data may not be released without their prior consent, and (c) allowed 14 days for such persons to inform the school, in writing, of all the directory data items they refuse to permit the District to designate as directory data about that student. The District will not release directory data earlier than 14 days after the initial written notice to the adult student or parent or guardian or after the District has been restricted from doing so by any of those parties. This notice serves as notification of the District's plan to release directory data as permitted in this policy. (School Board Policy - 8330)

## Education of Homeless Children

The McKinney-Vento Act defines homeless children and youth as: Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:

- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations
- living in emergency or transitional shelters
- abandoned in hospitals
- living in a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
- migratory children who qualify as homeless because the children are living in circumstances described above

# School District of Hustisford Notice of Child Find Activity

The school district must locate, identify, and evaluate all resident children with disabilities, including children with disabilities attending private schools, regardless of the severity of their disabilities. The school district has a special education screening program to locate and screen all children with suspected disabilities who are residents of the district and who have not graduated from high school. Upon request, the school district will screen any resident child who has not graduated high school to determine whether a special education referral is appropriate. A request may be made by contacting Terri Kreitzman, Director of Special Education, Hustisford School District at 920-349-8109 or by writing at P.O. Box 326, Hustisford, WI 53034.

## **The district conducts ongoing developmental screening of preschool children.**

The information is used to provide the parent with a profile of their child's current development and to provide suggestions for follow-up activities. We provide the Ages & Stages Questionnaires (ASQ-3) and developmental checklists to help track of children's development. The questionnaire includes questions about children's communication, gross motor, fine motor, problem solving, & personal-social skills. Professionals will be available to discuss the questionnaire and observe children at a scheduled open house. Parents learn about community services available to them and may speak with representatives of agencies serving families. The information from screening is also used to determine whether a child should be evaluated for a suspected disability. When school staff reasonably believes a child is a child with a disability, they refer the child for evaluation by a school district Individualized Education Program (IEP) team. The district sponsors an annual open house for 2-3 year olds in the fall. Watch local newspapers and the district newsletter for dates.

**A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to report the child to the school district in which the child resides.** Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made. The referral must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. Others who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child to the school district in which the child resides. A referral of a child residing in the Hustisford School District may be sent to Terri Kreitzman at the school district address above.

**The school district maintains pupil records, including information from screening and special education referral.** All records directly related to a student and maintained by the school district are pupil records. They include records maintained in any way including, but not limited to, computer storage media, video and audiotape, film, microfilm, and microfiche. Records maintained for personal use by a teacher and not available to others and records available only to persons involved in the psychological treatment of a child are not pupil records.

## **The school district maintains several classes of pupil records.**

- "Progress records" include grades, courses the child has taken, the child's attendance record, immunization records, required lead screening records, and records of school extra-curricular activities. Progress records must be maintained for at least five years after the child ceases to be enrolled.
- "Behavioral records" include such records as psychological tests, personality evaluations, records of conversations, written statements relating specifically to the pupil's behavior, tests relating specifically to achievement or measurement of ability, physical health records other than immunization and lead screening records, law enforcement officers' records, and other pupil records that are not "progress records." Law enforcement officers' records are maintained separately from other pupil records. Behavioral records may be maintained for no longer than one year after the child graduates or otherwise ceases to be enrolled, unless the parent specifies in writing that the records may be maintained for a longer period of time. The school district informs parent when pupil records are no longer needed to provide special education. At the request of the child's parents, the school district destroys the information that is no longer needed.
- "Directory data" includes the student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, photographs, degrees and awards received and the name of the school most recently previously attended by the student.

- "Pupil physical health records" include basic health information about a pupil, including the pupil's immunization records, an emergency medical card, a log of first aid and medicine administered to the pupil, an athletic permit card, a record concerning the pupil's ability to participate in an education program, any required lead screening records, the results of any routine screening test, such as for hearing, vision or scoliosis, and any follow-up to the test, and any other basic health information, as determined by the state superintendent. Any pupil record relating to a pupil's physical health that is not a pupil physical health record is treated as a patient health care record under sections 146.81 to 146.84, Wisconsin Statutes. Any pupil record concerning HIV testing is treated as provided under section 252.15, Wisconsin Statutes.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), and Section 118.125, Wisconsin Statutes, afford parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") the following rights with respect to education records:

- **The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the receipt of the request.** Parents or eligible students should submit to the school principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The principal will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where file records may be inspected. The school district will comply with the request without unnecessary delay and before any meeting about an individualized education program, or any due process hearing, and in no case more than 45 days after the request has been made. If any record includes information on more than one child, the parents of those children have the right to inspect and review only the information about their child or to be informed of that specific information. Upon request, the school district will give a parent or eligible student a copy of the behavioral records. Upon request, the school district will give the parent or eligible student a list of the types and locations of education records collected, maintained, or used by the district for special education. The school district will respond to reasonable requests for explanations and interpretations of the records. A representative of the parent may inspect and review the records.
- **The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes is inaccurate or misleading.** Parents or eligible students may ask the Hustisford School District to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write the school principal, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading. If the district decides not to amend the record, the district will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.
- **The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA and state law authorize disclosure without consent.** The exceptions are states in 34 CFR 99.31 and section 118.125(2)(a) to (m) and sub. (2m), Wisconsin Statutes. One exception that permits disclosure without consent is disclosures to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the school board; a person or company with whom the district has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility. Upon request, the district discloses education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. Also the district discloses "directory data" without consent, unless the parent notifies the district that it may not be released without prior parental consent.


